In most cases, titles are won by patiently accruing value throughout a draft or auction. During the Information stage, fantasy owners compile information about players at individual positions. Process involves comparison of players across positions.

We put a tremendous amount of hard work into our draft board, and you do as well. As such, you need to trust the fruits of these labors and adhere to your draft board as much as possible. The surest way to be able to extract maximum value is to prepare extensively ahead of time and then refrain from jumping around on the board on Draft Day. Approach the draft with an actuarial mindset, determined to squeeze maximum value out of every pick, and you will be poised for success.

* Players are color-coded by their value by round in a 10-team draft. 1st round is gold, 2nd round silver, 3rd round bronze, 4th round orange and 5th round green.

* Relevant 2006-07 statistical categories are listed, along with rankings for each, the number of games played and rankings in the aforementioned "Stat" category.

Evaluating Production Across a Spectrum: Lessons of “The Stat”

Our “Stat” category on our draft board calculates the standard deviation from the mean in all hitting categories and all pitching categories. In simple English, imagine a spectrum going across from left to right, with negative numbers on the left side, a “zero” in the middle and positive numbers on the right side.

We utilize this statistic for football, baseball, basketball, hockey and NASCAR as well as hockey. For hockey, we use all of the standard fantasy categories listed on the draft board to factor in for this statistical compilation.

A player’s performance in each category is plotted on one of these spectrums, with the most valuable players putting up most of their numbers on the most of their numbers on the positive side. Then, we add up the totals of every category, positive and negative. By using this tool, we can identify not merely how they performed, but how valuable their performances were in each category. Truly, this statistic serves as the ultimate baseline for the previous season’s production.

Don't Be That Guy!

To maximize your success in your hockey pool this year, don't be that guy who:

- Doesn't pay attention to all-around value as opposed to trying to collect single-category stars (for more on how to accomplish this, read our article about "The Stat" on Page 2.
- Takes Peter Forsberg, Teemu Selanne or Scott Niedermeyer in a "Draftmaster's League." If you cannot make transactions after your draft or auction, avoid players who may choose not to play this season.
- Overrates Alexander Ovechkin. He is a phenomenal young player, one of the best in the league, but his plus-minus number absolutely decimated his owners last year (check his shockingly low "stat" number for last season). D.C. has improved the surrounding cast, but don't mistake him for a first-round pick.
- Reaches for a goalie after "The Big Three." Wait for value at that point, folks.
- Sleeps on Eric Staal. He's coming back with a vengeance this year.

G: Biron (much better team around him than the end of last season), **Toskala** (doesn't play often enough to rack up a huge win total, but he's still respectable there and strong everywhere else)

LW: Semin (should be leap-frogged over many "name players"), **Tkachuk** (contrary to popular belief, he still has some hockey left in him), **Zetterberg** (not underrated at all, but people underestimate how good he is already)

C: Backstrom (Calder front-runner will be more mortal than the last two, but will have plenty of chances to succeed), **Roy** (solid but forgotten at a deep position), **J. Staal** (will have great synergy with his surrounding cast)

RW: Bertuzzi (very solid in his few games last year), **Gaborik** (see Zetterberg)

D: Chara (finally underrated again, and better days are ahead), **Hamalik** (gets no love from the experts, but produces every year)

Suggested League Guidelines

We recommend that you hold your auction or serpentine-style draft with 10 owners, selecting 18 players (6 defensemen, 3 goalies, 3 left wings, 3 centers, 3 right wings). In case of an auction, use a financial system that allots an average of \$11 per player.

Our preferred style of play is head-to-head roto, in which teams compete on a week-to-week head-up basis. Recommended categories are points, goals, assists, penalty minutes and plus-minus for forwards and defensemen and wins, least losses, shutouts, goals-against-average and save percentage for goalies. A rotating tiebreaker category should be utilized in the case of a 5-5 category tie. The starting lineup should consist of 2 goalies, 2 left wings, 2 centers, 2 right wings and 4 defensemen.

2007 Fantasy Overview

While Sidney Crosby is everyone's obvious pick for the top spot this season, several other players can come close to matching his overall production across many categories. Crosby is the epitome of the post-lockout phenom, but several other young superstars are thriving in the liberalized scoring climate. If you craft your fantasy team the way that the Buffalo Sabres assembled their real one in 2006-07, with speed and explosive upside as your cornerstone components, you maximize your chances for success.

Despite goaltending being at a premium in this atmosphere, few goalies remain worthy of selection in the top three rounds. The same holds true for defensemen, as a great many of them after Chris Pronger and Nicklas Lidstrom deliver similar all-around production.
