We at FantasyDrafthelp.com always emphasize the wisdom of our VIP approach to drafting: information and process lead to value. Of course, value is the single most important component of drafting or auctions. Even in the fantasy industry, this point is often overlooked.

In most cases, titles are won by patiently accruing value throughout a draft or auction.

During the Information stage, fantasy owners compile information about players at individual positions. Process involves comparison of players across all of the positions.

We put a tremendous amount of hard work into our draft board, and you do as well. As such, you need to trust the fruits of these labors and adhere to your draft board as much as possible. The surest way to be able to extract maximum value is to prepare extensively ahead of time and then refrain from jumping around on the board on Draft Day. Approach the draft with an actuarial mindset, determined to squeeze maximum value out of every pick, and you will be poised for success.

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Draft Board Decoder

The FantasyDrafthelp.com draft board contains all the relevant information you need right at your fingertips. For example, in terms of QB, RB, WR and TE:

^ Players are color-coded by their value by round in a 12-team draft. 1st round is gold, 2nd round silver, 3rd round bronze, 4th round orange and 5th round light blue.

^ The "Exp" column displays where each player placed in an "experts consensus board" of top fantasy magazines and "\$" signifies auction value.

^ The "Stat" column shows how each player performed on our standard deviation from the mean statistic in 2015 (stat details on Page 4).

^ Players in bold scored better than the statistical mean in all categories measured on our draft board.

^ 2015 yardage and TD totals are listed, along with rankings for each and rankings in the aforementioned "Stat" category. Also, as a new to the WR and TE boards, "TarCon" measures the completion percentage of targets to each player.

^ "Bye" denotes each player's bye week.

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Did you stay away from players like Colin Kaepernick, Arian Foster and Mike Wallace, who would have tanked your team last year? You're welcome!

Did you end up with players who helped you succeed last year like Eli Manning, Doug Martin and Jarvis Landry? You're welcome!

Evaluating Production Across a Spectrum: Lessons of “The Stat”

Our “Stat” category on our draft board calculates the standard deviation from the mean in all statistical categories. In simple English, imagine a spectrum going across from left to right, with negative numbers on the left side, a “zero” in the middle and positive numbers on the right side. We utilize this statistic for baseball, basketball, hockey and NASCAR as well as football. A player’s performance in each category is plotted on one of these spectrums, with the most valuable players putting up most of their numbers on the most of their numbers on the positive side. Then, we add up the totals of every category, positive and negative. By using this tool, we can identify not merely how they performed, but how valuable their performances were in each category. Truly, this statistic serves as the ultimate baseline for the previous season’s production.

FantasyDrafthelp.com Suggested League Guidelines

Many leagues start 1 QB, 2 RB, 2 WR, 1TE, 1 K and some D/ST combination. Some leagues allow the TE position to be WR or TE (in which case, only a few TEs merit any consideration) and some have a “flex” position, which is generally 1 additional RB or WR. With leagues who utilize defense, some deploy a team D/ST unit and some use individual D players.

The most common scoring system is a variation of the following: 4 points per passing TD, 1 point per 25 yards passing, 1 point per passing 2-point PAT, 6 points per receiving or rushing TD, 1 point per 10 yards rushing or receiving, 2 points per rushing or receiving 2-point PAT, 2 points per “big play touchdown” (50 or more yards), 1 point per kicking PAT, 3 points per FG, with a 1-point bonus at 45 yards, a 2-point bonus at 50 yards and a 3-point bonus at 55 yards, 6 points per defensive or special teams TD, 1 point per interception, sack or fumble recovered and 2 points per safety. In leagues that award 6 points for passing TDs, QBs are worth much more.

^ Don't be that guy who doesn't properly understand your league's scoring system. League setups are like snowflakes; no two are the same. Our draft board is configured to conform to a fairly basic scoring system, but your league could have some quirks that would force you to make adaptations to our board. Be aware.

^ Don't be that guy who doesn't pay enough attention and selects players who are already off the board. It's impolite to your leaguemates and it will invariably break your concentration when everyone howls at you and you've got to go back to Square One on a backup pick. To ensure that you are aware of everything that is going on during your draft, utilize a "grid" to track all teams, with the number of rounds going down the left side and the teams listed along the top.

^ Don't be that guy who approaches the draft like it's a night of epic decision-making. If you've done your homework, it's not. You merely find out where you're drafting and you "let the draft come to you"

2016 Fantasy Overview

^ This is perhaps the first season in the modern history of fantasy football with the WR position favored toward the top of the first round instead of RB.

This is due largely to the WR position featuring a greater amount of explosiveness towards the top relative to RBs. Our board still features more RBs with first-round value than WRs, but slightly fewer with second-round value. While there are about the same number of #1 RBs and #1 WRs, there are many, many more #2 WRs than #2 RBs, so don't get shut out on that second running back. At neither position is the overall draftable depth as plentiful as last year, so late-round prioritizing is a real issue in leagues with more rounds or teams than the norm.

^ QB depth is good at both the #1 and #2 level, so it's a testament to how much that Cam Newton and Aaron Rodgers can provide to your team that we have them listed as first-round value.

^ Rob Gronkowski still rules over the TE position, but the gap has narrowed a bit at the top and depth is pretty good, so you don't have to sell out to get him.

FDH College Rankings & Team Draft Guidelines

On the draft board, the numbers in parentheses are taken from a poll consensus. Take 6 owners and conduct a 7-round standard draft. Points will be assigned at 4 intervals: when the first College Football Playoff poll is released on November 1, when the poll is released on November 15, when the final poll is released on December 4 and when the final AP poll is released after the national title game. The November 1 poll accounts for 20% of the total score (with the exception of the bonus points, mentioned below), the November 15 poll accounts for 20% of the total score, the December 4 poll accounts for 20% of the total score and the final AP poll accounts for 40% of the total score.

For the first three polls, scoring is as follows: 1st place (50 points), 2nd place (45 points), 3rd place (43 points), 4th place (42 points), 5th place (41 points), 6th place (38 points), 7th place (37 points), 8th place (36 points), 9th place (35 points), 10th place (34 points), 11th place (30 points), 12th place (29 points), 13th place (28 points), 14th place (27 points), 15th place (26 points), 16th place (22 points), 17th place (21 points), 18th place (20 points), 19th place (19 points), 20th place (18 points), 21st place (13 points), 22nd place (12 points), 23rd place (11 points), 24th place (10 points), 25th place (9 points).

Points are doubled in the final poll, since it accounts for twice the point total of each of the three previous ones. Additional bonuses are awarded for the following accomplishments:

25 points for winning the National Championship Game, 15 points for winning the national semifinals, 10 points for earning a spot in the semifinals, 10 points for a conference title (or piece of one, for conferences without a championship game), 12 points for winning a "Big 6" non-semifinal bowl game, 6 points for earning a spot in a "Big 6" non-semifinal bowl, 5 points for winning a non-"Big 6" bowl game and 10 points for having the Heisman Trophy winner on one of your teams.

2017 NFL Draft

Preview

The default story going into any NFL Draft always involves the quarterbacks and, as of press time, 2017 looks strikingly like 2016, with no Andrew Luck-like perceived gimmes, but a handful of very good prospects. Assuming that he comes out early, Clemson's DeShaun Watson should be the top selection among them. He has many of the same strengths – and weaknesses – of Russell Wilson. Miami's Brad Kaaya and Chad Kelly of Mississippi – a predecessor of Watson at Clemson – are the others who look likely to land in the first round this far out.

Following in the footsteps of Todd Gurley (and perhaps, Ezekiel Elliott), this draft is likely to have two running backs capable of helping to restore prestige to the position: Leonard Fournette of LSU and Dalvin Cook of Florida State. Another strong season could put Stanford's Christian McCaffrey in that conversation. JuJu Smith-Schuster of USC is the consensus #1 wide receiver at this point, although LSU's Malachi Dupre could still pass him.

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FDH Best Games of the 2016 NFL Season

- 1 Seattle at New England (Week 10, Sunday Night Football on NBC): Super Bowls 49 and 50 will both be rematched this year, but 49 takes the lead billing thanks to the epic game they waged, the historic play that decided it and Denver's QB quandary.
- 2 Carolina at Denver (Week 1, Thursday Night Football on NBC): The last game of the 2015-16 season will be the first one of this campaign, with a more intact Panther team looking to cast a pall over the ring ceremony.
- 3 New England at Denver (Week 15, CBS): The Broncos beat the Pats in two of the last three AFC Championship Games, so even with a potential vacuum at passer (again), Denver won't be a pushover for the team that many expect to replace them this year.
- 4 Arizona at Carolina (Week 8, FOX): FOX's biggest game of the season should provide the competitive clash that did not materialize in last winter's NFC Championship Game.
- 5 Houston at Denver (Week 7, Monday Night Football on ESPN): The Skip Bayless Network will have loads of fun promoting Brock vs. Broncos on every program for weeks leading up to this one.
- 6 Seattle at Green Bay (Week 14, FOX): These teams bound by the legacies of Mike Holmgren and John Schneider met for the NFC Championship the season before last and many expect these perennial contenders to meet again on the road to the Super Bowl next winter.
- 7 New England at Pittsburgh (Week 7, CBS): With Peyton Manning now retired, the Steelers may now take the place as Brady/Belichick's greatest remaining rivals.
- 8 New England at Arizona (Week 1, Sunday Night Football on NBC): Both of the teams who lost on the last Championship Sunday are widely thought to have a great chance to win the next one.
