## Which Big Man Ya Got?

While it's a matchup denied to us in the Final Four, Duke C Jahill Okafor and Kentucky PF Karl-Anthony Towns are set to square off at last. The stakes? The #1 spot in the 2015 NBA Draft.

In a league that loves to trump up storylines to promote rivalries (Remember the 1995 Rookie of the Year "tie?" Or the "question" about whether LeBron or Carmelo was going to be the better pro?), having each of these dominant frontcourt players in both of the locations to play host to the Lakers will be like catnip to the central office. Okafor is surely more of an immovable presence down low, but Towns has a game compared by FDH Director of Research Nate Noy to a young Mailman Malone.

Beyond those two, combo guards D'Angelo Russell of Ohio State and Emmanuel Mudiay of Chinese pro ball are towards the top of the next tier, along with Croatian SG Mario Hezonja. Others on that level include Latvian PF Kristaps Porzingis, Kentucky C Willie Cauley-Stein and Duke SF Justise Winslow.

While this draft is not regarded as being as deep as the 2014 crop, it's conceivable that a future All-Star could be drafted as late as the lower part of the lottery. Kentucky's recent dominance on Draft Day will extend through this year, as at least three and maybe four Wildcats will be taken during the lottery part of the proceedings. Additionally, the National Champion Blue Devils are likely to have two players selected in the Top 10 and the other two teams in the Final Four, Wisconsin and Arizona, could see two of their players picked in the lottery portion.

## Preview Of FantasyDrafthelp.com Ultimate Fantasy Hoops Stat For 2015-16 Season

This is the FantasyDrafthelp.com statistic, the Ultimate Quantitative Baseline, based on the statistical principle of standard deviation from the mean. We utilize the standard fantasy categories: PPG, RPG, APG, ST, BL, TO, FG%, FT% and 3%. In each category, a spectrum is calculated from the best performance to the worst on a per-game basis. The numbers in each category are added together to create our statistic. An additional equalizer is injected to apply more points to each player at the positions of scarcer depth. What this stat truly does is to quantify beyond doubt how the stronger and weaker performances in each category add up to the absolute fantasy value for each player. As such, it establishes a baseline for performance that is more comprehensive than anything ever developed. A number over 1000 is considered elite. We have listed below the top 25 forwards and guards, top 10 centers and top 50 overall.

### 2015 Free Agency Preview

The list of players who technically will be or can be free agents this summer – including restricted free agents – is vast, but fairly meaningless in terms of conveying how the NBA landscape will change before 2015-16. As such, rather than indulging in pipe dreams about LeBron James or Tim Duncan joining a new team next year, the focus here is on the potential of actual players to create impact in their movements. And the impact pickings are scarce.

The crown jewel for this summer is Portland PF LaMarcus Aldridge, followed closely by Memphis C Marc Gasol. Few players can come close to matching the production of these two (aside from possibly Atlanta PF Paul Millsap and Detroit PF Greg Monroe), but purely in a defensive manner, Dallas C Tyson Chandler, Portland C Robin Lopez and LA Clippers C DeAndre Jordan are pretty important.

Dallas PG Rajon Rondo has demonstrated through his career both the potential to become an impact player with players around him who can shoot and an ability to be completely lost when he is not. Also down in Texas, San Antonio SF Danny Green would seem to be unlikely to leave a good situation, but he could have the ability to cash in and play a bigger role elsewhere.

Other players who can make a difference in the starting lineup and/or bench rotation of the teams they may join include Houston SF Josh Smith, Portland SG Wesley Matthews, Phoenix SG Marcus Thornton, New Orleans C Omer Asik and New York PF/C Andrea Bargnani.
