Which Big Man Ya Got?

While it's a matchup denied to us in the Final Four, Duke C Jahill Okafor and Kentucky PF Karl-Anthony Towns are set to square off at last. The stakes? The #1 spot in the 2015 NBA Draft.

In a league that loves to trump up storylines to promote rivalries (Remember the 1995 Rookie of the Year "tie?" Or the "question" about whether Lebron or Carmelo was going to be the better pro?), having each of these dominant frontcourt players in both of the locations to play host to the Lakers will be like catnip to the central office. Okafor is surely more of an immovable presence down low, but Towns has a game compared by FDH Director of Research Nate Nov to a young Mailman Malone.

Beyond those two, combo guards D'Angelo Russell of Ohio State and Emmanual Mudiay of Chinese pro ball are towards the top of the next tier, along with Croatian SG Mario Hezonja. Others on that level include Latvian PF Kristaps Porzingis, Kentucky C Willie Cauley-Stein and Duke SF Justise Winslow.

While this draft is not regarded as being as deep as the 2014 crop, it's conceivable that a future All-Star could be drafted as late as the lower part of the lottery. Kentucky's recent dominance on Draft Day will extend through this year, as at least three and maybe four Wildcats will be taken during the lottery part of the proceedings. Additionally, the National Champion Blue Devils are likely to have two players selected in the Top 10 and the other two teams in the Final Faur Wildean and Arizona could see the of their players epices selected in the lottery portion.

Preview Of FantasyDrafthelp.com Ultimate Fantasy Hoops Stat For 2015-16 Season

This is the FantasyDrafthelp.com statistic, the Ultimate Quantitative Baseline, based on the statistical principle of standard deviation from the mean. We utilize the standard fantasy categories: PPG, RPG, APG, ST, BL, TO, FG%, FT% and 3%. In each category, a spectrum is calculated from the best performance to the worst on a per-game basis. The numbers in each category are added together to create our statistic. An additional equalizer is injected to apply more points to each player at the positions of scarcer depth. What this stat truly does is to quantify beyond doubt how the stronger and weaker performances in each category add up to the absolute fantasy value for each player. As such, it establishes a baseline for performance that is more comprehensive than anything ever developed. A number over 1000 is considered elite. We have listed below the top 25 forwards and guards, top 10 centers and top 50 overall.

Correlation Of Top Players To NBA Titles

This list correlates to the rankings of present players on Page 6. Top-tier players are defined as those very few capable of winning a championship without a fellow super-elite player. The second tier represents players who were at an All-Star level at the time. Each year's champions are examined separately; for example, you will notice that Magic Johnson's star teammates were rated at different levels at different points of the 1980s dynasty. This list helps to go beyond the cliches about superstar players and their surrounding cast on championship teams to identify the specific dynamics most and least at play. It is interesting as well to study the anomalies on the list, the combinations of star players that have led to the least titles during these years.

FDH Alternate Playoff Seeding Proposal

With a new commissioner in Adam Silver comes a chance to examine policies in a fresh way. The perennial imbalance between the West and East certainly seems worse than ever. Under our alternate proposal, there would not be eight teams making the playoffs from each conference in separate brackets. Our format would do away with playoffs by conference.
