## Pro Football Draft Overview

Unusually, A Team Is The Story Of This Year's Draft


The 2018 NFL Draft (April 26-28 in Dallas) looms as an absolutely unique chapter in league history: an event defined less by the top players than by a team holding an unprecedented number of offseason chips. The Cleveland Browns, who at 1-31 are coming off of the single worst two-year stretch in NFL history and are inexplicably retaining their "don't-blame-me-everyone-elsesucks" excuse for a head coach, are at least coming into the draft with what you should have when you make the unprecedented decision to tank two seasons so brutally: a beefed-up front office, $\$ 100$ million in cap space (albeit, much of it regrettably used already on non-impact players) and five picks in the first two rounds with two in the top four overall. More than any other team in recent memory, they will dictate the terms of the draft, as well as the overall offseason.
With either the first or the fourth overall pick, Penn State RB Saquon Barkley, the rare player at his position to be rated so highly these days, could be in play. The top QBs, Sam Darnold of USC, Josh Rosen of UCLA, Josh Allen of Wyoming and Oklahoma QB Baker Mayfield, are also in play for one of the two picks. Louisville's Lamar Jackson is also in play as a first-round passer, as could Oklahoma State's Mason Rudolph. The first round projects as a real smorgasbord in terms of positional talent. The other skill position talents that might make this cut include RBs Derrius Guice of LSU and Ronald Jones of USC, WRs Calvin Ridley of Alabama, Courtland Sutton of SMU, James Washington of Oklahoma State and Christian Kirk of Texas A\&M and San Diego State TE Dallas Goedert. Also, Notre Dame G Quenton Nelson is the rare interior offensive lineman who is in play in the Top 5 overall.
The two biggest defensive prospects are Alabama CB/S Minkah Fitzpatrick and North Carolina State DE Bradley Chubb. Other candidates to go in the first half of the round include Florida State $S$ Derwin James, Ohio State CB Denzel Ward, Michigan DT Maurice Hurst, Washington DT Vita Vea and Virginia Tech ILB Tremaine Edwards.

## First Look Ahead to 2019 Pro Football Draft

The strength of next year's draft is in a non-glamour area, but a very important one nonetheless. Ohio State DE is the best edge rusher in the group, but will have stiff competition to be the top pick from DT Ed Oliver of Houston and Dexter Lawrence of Clemson. Other top five candidates in this group include Alabama DE/DT Raekwon Davis, Michigan DE/DT Rashan Gary, Auburn DE Marlon Davidson and Clemson's DE Clelin Ferrell, Miami DE Joe Jackson and DT Christian Wilkins. At OT, Washington's Trey Adams, Wisconsin's David Edwards and 'Bama's Jonah Williams look to go high in the first round.
A year out, the QB picture is cloudier than usual. From the Big 10, Missouri's Drew Lock, Michigan's Shea Patterson and Northwestern's Clayton Thorson all have questions to answer this fall, but each could skyrocket with a strong season. Jacob Eason in his first year at Washington after transferring from Georgia and Auburn's Jarrett Stidham also cannot be ruled out as high picks.
With the Top 10 seeming to be dominated by players from the aforementioned positions, it will be difficult for others to sneak in, but these players have a chance: Mississippi WR AJ Brown, Texas WR Collin Johnson, Miami WR Ahmmon Richards, Florida WR WR Tyrie Cleveland, LSU CB Greedy Williams and Georgia DB DeAndre Baker.

## Draft PlayAlong Game

We at FantasyDrafthelp.com have devised a contest to help you and your friends measure your acumen on Draft Day. It's the FantasyDrafthelp.com Mock Draft Game (credit to Fantasy Drafthelp.com contributor Bob Benak for inventing the game). Each participant submits a mock draft before the proceedings ... and then all parties compete in a separate "live draft competition."

Each board is scored separately, but the scores of the two are compiled to crown the Grand Champion of Draft Day. Here's the scoring system:

Picks \#1-4 are weighted at one point apiece. Picks \#5-8 are weighted at two points apiece. Picks \#9-12 are weighted at three points apiece. Picks \#13-16 are weighted at four points apiece. Picks \#17-20 are weighted at five points apiece. Picks \#21-24 are weighted at six points apiece. Picks \#25-28 are weighted at seven points apiece. Picks \#29-32 are weighted at eight points apiece
Players may "roll over" their picks from the completed mock draft to the live draft if a player remains on the board ... or they may cover themselves with another pick. Example: a player has Denver taking Josh Rosen with the \#5 pick on the mock draft they turned in at the outset. That would count for two points if the pick is correct. If Rosen is still on the board when the Broncos are on the clock, the player is not obligated to pick Trubisky during the live draft. He may "roll over" the pick, choosing to try to win two points in both the live and completed mock draft categories. Or he may try to cover himself with another pick. For example, should he correctly pick Saquon Barkley in the live draft part of the competition, he would gain the two points in the live draft but win no points in the completed mock draft part of the competition, in which he incorrectly picked Rpsen. So strategy is at a premium during this competition. This game also puts great emphasis on correctly making picks later in the first round, when chances for success are the most difficult. Picking a player accurately in the later part of the first round on both the completed mock draft and the live mock draft can ensure a thrilling, come-from-behind victory. If you and your friends want to take your enjoyment of Draft Day to the next level by competing and strategizing along with the wizards of the NFL, try our game and enjoy!

## 2018 Rookie Class Fantasy Analysis


#### Abstract

For the most part, 2018 doesn't shape up as a very out-of-theordinary fantasy football season for rookies (little immediate QB production, decent early contributions at WR).


> Penn State RB Saquon Barkley projects to be perhaps a generational talent at his position and, as such, should certainly be a first-round pick - and potentially, a high first-round pick depending on where he lands. LSU's Derrius Guice has a pretty good all-around skill set, as does San Diego State's Rashaad Penny. USC's Ronald Jones II is a very explosive back who has a pretty high fantasy ceiling, even as a rookie. In the national championship game, Georgia's Sony Michel - a shifty back with above-average power and acceleration - seemed to surpass his teammate, the super-powerful Nick Chubb, but while neither presently projects as a three-down back, both could be valuable contributors in fantasy even as rookies.

> At the WR position, the ceivling of the top players profile as \#3 receivers off the bat and \#2 receivers as rookies. Alabama's Calvin Ridley is pretty smooth in many areas and would be a franchise receiver if he had more of a physical presence. Texas A\&M's Christian Kirk is the opposite of Ridley in many ways. Courtland Sutton of SMU and James Washington of Oklahoma State also have a chance to be at least good sport-start opptions off the bat. San Diego State TE Dallas Goedert and his positional counterpart Hayden Hurst of South Carolina can potentially contribute as rookies.
> As is the case in the vast majority of seasons, there are no QBs who even come close to profiling as immediate fantasy starters.

# Why Value Matters In Fantasy \& Pro Sports Drafts

On our FANTASYDRAFTHELP.COM INSIDER webcasts, we've discussed this point many times, but we're continually reminded of the need to readdress it: the very real link between fantasy sports drafts and the so-called real kind.

12 years ago, when the Buffalo Bills selected Donte Whitner with the eighth overall pick at a time when he was considered a fringe Top 20 player at best, FDH Senior Editor Jason Jones and I ridiculed the pick in a real-time webcast.

We explained that Marv Levy, who was new to the Buffalo front office, clearly had no concept of value. Top10 picks must become franchise players at their positions. If, for whatever reason, you are fixated on a player unworthy of the draft slot, trade back and obtain the value collectively, through the desired player and additional picks, but always get value for your pick.

And if a Top 10 pick must become a franchise player, then a Top 5 pick must become one of the elite players in the league. For a team like the Browns that squandered numerous draft picks in the last dozen years under the auspices of such luminaries as Dwight Clark, Butch Davis, Shoebox Pete Garcia, Eric Mangini, Mike Lombardi, Ray Farmer and Sashi Brown, the fourth overall pick in the draft has to be a home run and cannot be used on a player not deemed safe enough by the collective brainpower of NFL personnel people. There is no margin for error.

We at FDH don't have to educate skilled fantasy sports owners on the concept of value. This is something they know, or at the very least intuit, as they go through their draft or auction preparation. We always say that you win by obtaining value with every pick. While that ideal is almost impossible, you have to come as close as you can. That means that your high picks have to perform at the level forecasted and your mid-round and lower-round picks must outperform their draft slots. We have always emphasized that the same precept holds true in professional sports drafts. Winning organizations make the most of their draft picks and they know how to proceed in a measured fashion. They do not panic.
