We at FantasyDrafthelp.com always emphasize the wisdom of our VIP approach to drafting: information and process lead to value. Of course, value is the single most important component of drafting or auctions. Even in the fantasy industry, this point is often overlooked.

In most cases, titles are won by patiently accruing value throughout a draft or auction.

During the Information stage, fantasy owners compile information about players at individual positions. Process involves comparison of players across all of the positions.

We put a tremendous amount of hard work into our draft board, and you do as well. As such, you need to trust the fruits of these labors and adhere to your draft board as much as possible. The surest way to be able to extract maximum value is to prepare extensively ahead of time and then refrain from jumping around on the board on Draft Day. Approach the draft with an actuarial mindset, determined to squeeze maximum value out of every pick, and you will be poised for success.

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## Draft Board Decoder

The FantasyDrafthelp.com draft board contains all the relevant information you need right at your fingertips. For example, in terms of QB, RB, WR and TE:

^ Players are color-coded by their value by round in a 12-team draft. 1st round is gold, 2nd round silver, 3rd round bronze, 4th round orange and 5th round light blue.

^ The "Exp" column displays where each player placed in an "experts consensus board" of top fantasy magazines and websites.

^ The "Stat" column shows how each player performed on our standard deviation from the mean statistic in 2017 (stat details on Page 4).

^ Players in bold scored better than the statistical mean in all categories measured on our draft board.

^ 2018 yardage and TD totals are listed, along with rankings for each and rankings in the aforementioned "Stat" category. Also, as a new to the WR and TE boards, "Ctch%" measures the completion percentage of targets to each player.

^ "Bye" denotes each player's bye week.

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## Evaluating Production Across a Spectrum: Lessons of “The Stat”

Our “Stat” category on our draft board calculates the standard deviation from the mean in all statistical categories.

In simple English, imagine a spectrum going across from left to right, with negative numbers on the left side, a “zero” in the middle and positive numbers on the right side. We utilize this statistic for baseball, basketball, hockey and NASCAR as well as football. A player’s performance in each category is plotted on one of these spectrums, with the most valuable players putting up most of their numbers on the most of their numbers on the positive side. Then, we add up the totals of every category, positive and negative. By using this tool, we can identify not merely how they performed, but how valuable their performances were in each category. Truly, this statistic serves as the ultimate baseline for the previous season’s production.

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### FantasyDrafthelp.com Suggested League Guidelines

Many leagues start 1 QB, 2 RB, 2 WR, 1 TE, 1 K and some D/ST combination. Some leagues allow the TE position to be WR or TE (in which case, only a few TEs merit any consideration) and some have a “flex” position, which is generally 1 additional RB or WR. With leagues who utilize defense, some deploy a team D/ST unit and some use individual D players.

The most common scoring system is a variation of the following: 4 points per passing TD, 1 point per 25 yards passing, 1 point per passing 2-point PAT, 6 points per receiving or rushing TD, 1 point per 10 yards rushing or receiving, 2 points per rushing or receiving 2-point PAT, 2 points per “big play touchdown” (50 or more yards), 1 point per kicking PAT, 3 points per FG, with a 1-point bonus at 45 yards, a 2-point bonus at 50 yards and a 3-point bonus at 55 yards, 6 points per defensive or special teams TD, 1 point per interception, sack or fumble recovered and 2 points per safety. In leagues that award 6 points for passing TDs, QBs are worth much more.

Our draft board is configured to conform to a fairly basic scoring system, but your league could have some quirks that would force you to make adaptations to our board. Be aware.

^ Don't be that guy who doesn't pay enough attention and selects players who are already off the board. It's impolite to your leaguemates and it will invariably break your concentration when everyone howls at you and you've got to go back to Square One on a backup pick. To ensure that you are aware of everything that is going on during your draft, utilize a "grid" to track all teams, with the number of rounds going down the left side and the teams listed along the top.

^ Don't be that guy who approaches the draft like it's a night of epic decision-making. If you've done your homework, it's not. You merely find out where you're drafting and you "let the draft come to you."

## 2019 Fantasy Overview

- ^ At RB, more starting jobs than usual seem to be set coming into this season, so you should be aiming to get at least 3 and probably 4 RB who figure to be in a lead role.
- ^ Conversely from the status of 2018, depth at WR is a bit deeper than RB in the early-to-mid rounds, so plan accordingly.
- ^ As it was in 2018, depth at both #1 QB and #2 QB is very good. Getting two backups maximizes the chance of having the options that you really want – including possible trade bait.
- ^ In a now-Gronkless world, TE remains top-heavy in terms of available options. If you don't get one of the top 3 players, just wait and try to 2 backups.

## The Next Form of NCAA Football Evolution?

With the increasing consolidation of college football's super-conferences and the increasing amount of money available to the major programs, the idea that Athletic sportswriter Stewart Mandel has been predicting for years becomes increasingly plausible: one super-league comprised solely of the top-level programs in the country. It's an intriguing idea, so we thought we'd play it out to see what it might resemble.

We're going with 20 teams split into four divisions. The regular season would be 14 games long, as every team would play everyone in their own division as well as two of the other three divisions. The divisional structure is off to the right.

Each division would have one home game each week being televised by a distinctive network: NBC, CBS, FOX and YouTube – with the reasoning for the latter being that it is inevitable that a streaming service would get involved and the committee's preference might well be for one without a subscription model like so many of the others. ESPN, ABC and FS1 would televise the other games, except for one game each that ESPN and FS1 would lose during the bye weeks, 5-9.

The season would have to begin the weekend before Labor Day and, with the one bye week, would end the weekend after Thanksgiving with a full slate of games.

Conference championships would obviously be a thing of the past. On the day after the end of the regular season, the same first Sunday in December when the College Football Playoff pairings are announced, the committee would announce the eight seeds for the season-ending tournament. The four division winners would earn automatic seeds with four at-large teams with no limitations on how many can come from each division. The eight teams would be seeded without regard to whether they are division winners or at-large, as the committee handling the matter would simply try to rank them most accurately from 1-8.

Much as there are six cities rotating in the New Year's Six, there would be six rotating for the annual quarterfinals and semifinals, with the national championship game remaining as an open bid process amongst more eligible cities. The quarterfinals would take place on the second Thursday of the month, then the next night, then a doubleheader on Saturday. NBC, CBS, and YouTube would rotate each year between these games, with the same network televising both games on Saturday. The semifinals would always take place late afternoon and nighttime on New Year's Day with the national championship remaining on the second Monday of January and the semifinals and championship would rotate between ESPN and FOX each year.

With such a system, college football would be saturated with high-quality matchups each Saturday, creating a dynamic with even more competitiveness than the NFL. Every team would face every other team at least once every two years, bringing new life to infrequently-visited historic rivalries and almost certainly animating new ones. It's a radically different form of big-time college football, but it's probably closer in line to where the game is going than many of the less-radical proposals being floated.

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## FDH College Rankings & Team Draft Guidelines

On the draft board, the numbers in parentheses are taken from a poll consensus. Take 6 owners and conduct a 7-round standard draft. Points will be assigned at 4 intervals: when the first College Football Playoff poll is released on October 29, when the poll is released on November 12, when the final poll is released on December 1 and when the final AP poll is released after the national title game. The October 29 poll accounts for 20% of the total score (with the exception of the bonus points, mentioned below), the November 12 poll accounts for 20% of the total score, the December 1 poll accounts for 20% of the total score and the final AP poll accounts for 40% of the total score.

For the first three polls, scoring is as follows: 1st place (50 points), 2<sup>nd</sup> place (45 points), 3<sup>rd</sup> place (43 points), 4<sup>th</sup> place (42 points), 5<sup>th</sup> place (41 points), 6<sup>th</sup> place (38 points), 7<sup>th</sup> place (37 points), 8<sup>th</sup> place (36 points), 9<sup>th</sup> place (35 points), 10<sup>th</sup> place (34 points), 11<sup>th</sup> place (30 points), 12<sup>th</sup> place (29 points), 13<sup>th</sup> place (28 points), 14<sup>th</sup> place (27 points), 15<sup>th</sup> place (26 points), 16<sup>th</sup> place (22 points), 17<sup>th</sup> place (21 points), 18<sup>th</sup> place (20 points), 19<sup>th</sup> place (19 points), 20<sup>th</sup> place (18 points), 21<sup>st</sup> place (13 points), 22<sup>nd</sup> place (12 points), 23<sup>rd</sup> place (11 points), 24<sup>th</sup> place (10 points), 25<sup>th</sup> place (9 points).

Points are doubled in the final poll, since it accounts for twice the point total of each of the three previous ones. Additional bonuses are awarded for the following accomplishments:

25 points for winning the National Championship Game, 15 points for winning the national semifinals, 10 points for earning a spot in the semifinals, 10 points for a conference title (or piece of one, for conferences without a championship game), 12 points for winning a "Big 6" non-semifinal bowl game, 6 points for earning a spot in a "Big 6" non-semifinal bowl, 5 points for winning a non-"Big 6" bowl game and 10 points for having the Heisman Trophy winner on one of your teams.

We added a new wrinkle to the game in 2018, an additional level if you want more depth to the game. It's called the "Top 3" option, which awards points for finishing in the Top 3 of a conference division. 250 points go to the top team in a division (with 100 bonus points for the winner of the conference championship game), 150 points to the second-place team and 50 points to the third-place team. For teams in the Big 12 where there are no divisions, the point totals remain the same, but with 35 points for fourth place and 20 points for fifth place. Records are determined first by conference record, with overall record serving as a tiebreaker, with a tie being proclaimed anytime that both records are the same. Our projected standings for each conference are listed on Page 9.

## 2020 NFL Draft Preview

Other candidates for the Top 10 include DB Grant Delpit of LSU, Isaiah Simmons of Clemson and CJ Henderson of Florida and Alabama LB Dylan Moses.

## 2019 FDH UQB Team Stat

For a decade now, FantasyDrafthelp.com has featured the UQB, or Ultimate Quantitative Baseline, as the most accurate measure of what a player achieved the previous season in fantasy production. Now, for the first time, The FDH Lounge has a non-fantasy version of this statistic for team production: the most accurate version of how good, or bad, a given team was during the previous season.

Our statistic simply adds together the ranking of 10 different indexes: The FDH Lounge final power rankings for 2018, The FDH Lounge rankings for impressiveness of victories (based equally on a team's victories and the strength of the schedule that they played), offensive yards gained, defensive yards allowed, DVOA, Offensive DVOA, Defensive DVOA, Special Teams DVOA, The FDH Lounge 2019 NFL Draft ratings and The FDH Lounge 2019 NFL offseason ratings. The lower the number, the better each team did. Numbers in parentheses represent where the team placed in the final UQB rankings for the 2018 regular season. These numbers may surprise you in some ways and then again, they may not.
