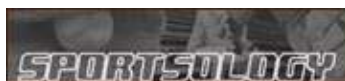

Pro Football Draft Overview

America's North Coast Welcomes The Proceedings

Roger Goodell, with his Vince McMahon-like fixation on "being the first to get back to 'normal'" in the world, will want you to believe that the 2021 NFL Draft on the shores of Lake Erie, is completely back to the pre-COVID 19 reality. The reality is that every event planned for Cleveland at the end of April is going to be a watered-down version of what the host cities will receive the next few years.

As for the event itself, the 2021 NFL Draft will be one of the deepest in recent league history, with the greatest pools of talent at offensive tackle, the most important position of quarterback and at wide receiver – just the latest in a wave of standout draft classes at wideout which has already led to arguably the deepest talent base that the league has ever seen at the position. Heisman Trophy winner DeVonta Smith is rail-thin, but impossibly tough as well as explosive, while his Alabama teammate Jaylen Waddle is a sure-thing playmaker. Ja'Marr Chase of LSU also has the

credentials to go first among this historic class of receivers. There is one more receiver, tight end Kyle Pitts of Florida, who rates at such a historic level as a prospect that he rates among these talents in terms of the potential to vastly improve an offense single-handedly.

Clemson's Trevor Lawrence has long loomed as the best draft prospect in years, with Ohio State's Justin Fields presumed to ride shotgun in public perception among quarterbacks, but others have risen to challenge Fields's status: BYU's Zach Wilson, North Dakota State's Trey Lance and Alabama's Mac Jones. Florida's Kyle Trask and Texas A&M's Kellen Mond would both be picked higher than they will be most other years.

Oregon's Penei Sewell is essentially the Lawrence of offensive tackles, a can't miss franchise player. Northwestern's Rashawn Slater, Virginia Tech's Christian Darrisaw, Texas's Samuel Cosmi, Notre Dame's Liam Eichenberg, North Dakota State's Dillon Radunz, Oklahoma State's Teven Jenkins and Alabama's Alex Leatherwood are going to keep many quarterbacks safe in the next decade-plus.

Other candidates to be selected very high include OLBs Micah Parsons of Penn State and Jeremiah Owusu-Koramoah of Notre Dame, DEs Gregory Rousseau of Miami and Kwity Paye of Michigan and CBs Caleb Farley of Virginia Tech and Patrick Surtain II of Alabama.

First Look Ahead to 2022 Pro Football Draft

If the Coronavirus crisis hasn't taught us all that you can't take anything for granted, consider how the evaluation of pro prospects has been impacted over the past year. With less film available than ever, workouts and Silly Season content has become bigger than ever. God Willing, as society gets closer to normal throughout 2021, a normal college season can provide greater clarity on the next crop of pro players.

When the 2022 NFL Draft convenes in Lost Wages next spring, there will be one constant that never changes: QBs will be at center stage. North Carolina's Sam Howell has the pole position at present despite less-than-ideal height. Oregon's Tyler Shough, Oklahoma's Spencer Rattler and USC's Kedon Slovis are other hurlers right on his heels.

LSU CB Derek Stingley Jr. is arguably the finest prospect at his position in quite a few years. However, edge rusher Kayvon Thibodeaux of Oregon could still challenge him as the top defensive player taken.

In terms of offensive skill players, Clemson WR Justyn Ross will fit right into the league's burgeoning collection of large playmakers. Others of note at his position include Georgia's George Pickens, Oklahoma's Jadon Haselwood and Ohio State's Garrett Wilson.

Draft Play- Along Game

We at FantasyDrafthelp.com have devised a contest to help you and your friends measure your acumen on Draft Day. It's the FantasyDrafthelp.com Mock Draft Game (credit to Fantasy Drafthelp.com contributor Bob Benak for inventing the game). Each participant submits a mock draft before the proceedings ... and then all parties compete in a separate "live draft competition."

Each board is scored separately, but the scores of the two are compiled to crown the Grand Champion of Draft Day. Here's the scoring system:

Picks #1-4 are weighted at one point apiece.
Picks #5-8 are weighted at two points apiece.
Picks #9-12 are weighted at three points apiece.
Picks #13-16 are weighted at four points apiece.
Picks #17-20 are weighted at five points apiece.
Picks #21-24 are weighted at six points apiece.
Picks #25-28 are weighted at seven points apiece.
Picks #29-32 are weighted at eight points apiece

Players may "roll over" their picks from the completed mock draft to the live draft if a player remains on the board ... or they may cover themselves with another pick. Example: a player has Detroit taking Caleb Farley with the #7 pick on the mock draft they turned in at the outset. That would count for two points if the pick is correct. If Brown is still on the board when the Lions are on the clock, the player is not obligated to pick Farley during the live draft. He may "roll over" the pick, choosing to try to win two points in both the live and completed mock draft categories. Or he may try to cover himself with another pick. For example, should he correctly pick Patrick Surtain II in the live draft part of the competition, he would gain the two points in the live draft but win no points in the completed mock draft part of the competition, in which he incorrectly picked Farley. So strategy is at a premium during this competition. This game also puts great emphasis on correctly making picks later in the first round, when chances for success are the most difficult. Picking a player accurately in the later part of the first round on both the completed mock draft and the live mock draft can ensure a thrilling, come-from-behind victory. If you and your friends want to take your enjoyment of Draft Day to the next level by competing and strategizing along with the wizards of the NFL, try our game and enjoy!

2021 Rookie Class Fantasy Analysis

This is a year of tremendous excitement for NFL rookies in a fantasy sense, maybe the best in many, many years and it fits into a landscape with a pre-existing deep crop of top-flight wide receivers in the league. The dynamic duo from Alabama, Heisman winner DeVonta Smith and Jaylen Waddle, combine with another player with a national championship pedigree, Ja'Marr Chase of LSU, to deliver immediate top-flight production at the position. The Big 10 yields two additional high-level talents, Purdue's Rondale Moore and Minnesota's Rashod Bateman.

Tight end doesn't usually generate many franchise player candidates, so it's worth noting when one appears and this one is the real deal: Florida's Kyle Pitts.

Until recently, QBs weren't anticipated for Year 1 fantasy production, but Joe Burrow and Justin Herbert have shown just what is possible right off the bat. As such, Clemson's Trevor Lawrence could provide first-string performance as soon as this fall. Others who could be good for spot starts this year include Ohio State's Justin Fields, BYU's Zach Wilson, North Dakota State's Trey Lance and Alabama's Mac Jones.

In an era that sees some of the top RBs underdrafted by the pros (remember Nick Chubb?) because of the oversimplified groupthink regarding the fungibility of the position, don't be swayed if this draft's top two talents at the position don't get drafted as high as they deserve. Clemson's Travis Etienne and Alabama's Najee Harris are big-time.

Why Value Matters In Fantasy & Pro Sports Drafts

On our FANTASYDRAFTHelp.COM INSIDER webcasts, we've discussed this point many times, but we're continually reminded of the need to readdress it: the very real link between fantasy sports drafts and the so-called real kind.

15 years ago, when the Buffalo Bills selected Donte Whitner with the eighth overall pick at a time when he was considered a fringe Top 20 player at best, FDH Senior Editor Jason Jones and I ridiculed the pick in a real-time webcast.

We explained that Marv Levy, who was new to the Buffalo front office, clearly had no concept of value. Top10 picks must become franchise players at their positions. If, for whatever reason, you are fixated on a player unworthy of the draft slot, trade back and obtain the value collectively, through the desired player and additional picks, but always get value for your pick.

And if a Top 10 pick must become a franchise player, then a Top 5 pick must become one of the elite players in the league. For a team like the Browns that squandered numerous draft picks under the auspices of such luminaries as Butch Davis, Shoebox Pete Garcia, Eric Mangini, Mike Lombardi, Ray Farmer and Sashi Brown, the tenth overall pick in the draft has to be a home run and cannot be used on a player not deemed safe enough by the collective brainpower of NFL personnel people. There is no margin for error.

We at FDH don't have to educate skilled fantasy sports owners on the concept of value. This is something they know, or at the very least intuit, as they go through their draft or auction preparation. We always say that you win by obtaining value with every pick. While that ideal is almost impossible, you have to come as close as you can. That means that your high picks have to perform at the level forecasted and your mid-round and lower-round picks must outperform their draft slots. We have always emphasized that the same precept holds true in professional sports drafts. Winning organizations make the most of their draft picks and they know how to proceed in a measured fashion. They do not panic.
