## Draft Board Decoder

The FantasyDrafthelp.com draft board contains all the relevant information you need right at your fingertips. For example, in terms of QB, RB, WR and TE:

^ Players are color-coded by their value by round in a 12-team draft. 1st round is gold, 2nd round silver, 3rd round bronze, 4th round orange and 5th round light blue.

^ \$ denotes the dollar value in auction leagues.

^ The "Exp" column displays where each player placed in an "experts consensus board" of top fantasy magazines and websites.

^ The "Stat" column shows how each player performed on our standard deviation from the mean statistic in 2020 (stat details on Page 4).

^ 2020 yardage and TD totals are listed, along with rankings for each and rankings in the aforementioned "Stat" category. Also, on the WR and TE boards, "CAT%" measures the completion percentage of targets to each player.

^ "Bye" denotes each player's bye week.

## FantasyDrafthelp.com Suggested League Guidelines

Many leagues start 1 QB, 2 RB, 2 WR, 1 TE, 1 K and some D/ST combination. Some leagues allow the TE position to be WR or TE (in which case, only a few TEs merit any consideration) and some have a "flex" position, which is generally 1 additional RB or WR. With leagues who utilize defense, some deploy a team D/ST unit and some use individual D players.

The most common scoring system is a variation of the following: 4 points per passing TD, 1 point per 25 yards passing, 1 point per passing 2-point PAT, 6 points per receiving or rushing TD, 1 point per 10 yards rushing or receiving, 2 points per rushing or receiving 2-point PAT, 2 points per "big play touchdown" (50 or more yards), 1 point per kicking PAT, 3 points per FG, with a 1-point bonus at 45 yards, a 2-point bonus at 50 yards and a 3-point bonus at 55 yards, 6 points per defensive or special teams TD, 1 point per interception, sack or fumble recovered and 2 points per safety. In leagues that award 6 points for passing TDs, QBs are worth much more.

## Evaluating Production Across a Spectrum: Lessons of "The Stat"

Our "Stat" category on our draft board calculates the standard deviation from the mean in all statistical categories.

In simple English, imagine a spectrum going across from left to right, with negative numbers on the left side, a "zero" in the middle and positive numbers on the right side. We utilize this statistic for baseball, basketball, hockey and NASCAR as well as football. A player's performance in each category is plotted on one of these spectrums, with the most valuable players putting up most of their numbers on the most of their numbers on the positive side. Then, we add up the totals of every category, positive and negative. By using this tool, we can identify not merely how they performed, but how valuable their performances were in each category. Truly, this statistic serves as the ultimate baseline for the previous season's production.

## Fantasy Over-Under Game & Draft Board

We've come up with yet another permutation on the fantasy football experience at FantasyDrafthelp.com: the Fantasy Over-Under Game. It's based on the projected win totals released every year by the sports books.

For our game, ideally, you have four owners with three standard serpentine rounds. Each owner will take a team to finish either over or under their projected win total. The teams listed on our draft board to the right are considered by us to be the ones most likely to go over or under their projected totals by a decent amount.

Here's the scoring system:

- ^ Correct by 5 or more games: 25 points
- ^ Correct by 3-4 games: 16 points
- ^ Correct by 2 games: 7 points
- ^ Correct by 1 game: 4 points
- ^ Right on the win total: 0 points
- ^ Incorrect by 1 game: -4 points
- ^ Incorrect by 2 games: -7 points
- ^ Incorrect by 3-4 games: -16 points
- ^ Incorrect by 5 or more games: -25 points

## Don't Be That Guy

^ Don't be that guy who is unprepared and whines in the mid to late rounds that everyone worth taking is already gone. They're not; you're just unprepared.

^ Don't be that guy who doesn't properly understand your league's scoring system. League setups are like snowflakes; no two are the same. Our draft board is configured to conform to a fairly basic scoring system, but your league could have some quirks that would force you to make adaptations to our board. Be aware.

^ Don't be that guy who doesn't pay enough attention and selects players who are already off the board. It's impolite to your leaguemates and it will invariably break your concentration when everyone howls at you and you've got to go back to Square One on a backup pick. To ensure that you are aware of everything that is going on during your draft, utilize a "grid" to track all teams, with the number of rounds going down the left side and the teams listed along the top.

^ Don't be that guy who approaches the draft like it's a night of epic decision-making. If you've done your homework, it's not. You merely find out where you're drafting and you "let the draft come to you."

## As Steve Sabol Takes His Rightful Place In The Pro Football Hall Of Fame, Honor His And His Father's Legacies By Revitalizing NFL Films

Steve Sabol: "There's 100 million feet of film in our library. It's the largest sports film library in the world and the only other human endeavor that has been recorded more extensively on 16mm film than the National Football League is World War II. And eventually we're going to pass 'em. I think eventually, our entire library will be available to fans on the Internet. So if you're an Earl Campbell fan and you want to see all of Earl Campbell's touchdowns, you'll be able to access our library and just punch up 'Earl Campbell touchdowns' and every one of his touchdown runs will come up. Or if you're a Browns fan and you wanna see something with Bernie Kosar or Brian Sipe, every Brian Sipe touchdown pass will be accessible through the Internet. It's still three, four, maybe five years away and it's going to come through NFL.com, but we're in the process now of logging and categorizing that."

That was June 9, 2010 on The FDH Lounge. In terms of the thesis posed by this article's headline, let's start with the timeline theorized by Steve in that interview: that by 2015 at the latest, in his estimation, NFL Films would have that ultimate user-friendly functionality built into NFL.com. So what happened?

The most cynical interpretation would be that Steve's untimely passing in 2012 freed the cash-conscious league to abandon this potentially difficult-to-monetize feature. Without hard evidence, I won't speculate that this is the case, even as a host of articles in the "NFL Network era of NFL Films" have documented the relentless cost-cutting effects of the Roger Goodell/Jerry Jones ethos of "Profit Uber Alles." But regardless, the idea itself is yet another example of the bottomless genius of Steve and his father Ed — and one that the league has failed to adopt for no apparent justifiable reason.

Those same articles outlining the budgeting constraints on NFL Films actually dating back to the 2000s point out how the heart and soul of what made NFL Films such a cultural powerhouse — the patience and creativity to tell amazing stories — is evident in very little of the current product. This is not to slight the staff of NFL Films, men and women who by all accounts still believe in the mission of the Sabols and who would be happy to be given the latitude to produce material that stands side-by-side with the greatness of the past.

But along those lines, when is the last time that you watched an NFL Films production that really reminded you of the classic content? Something with the musical scoring, the poetic narration, the humanity of the participants captured by the cameras? To draw this point out to a more sinister direction, maybe that's one reason that the NFL Network never leaned nearly as heavily on the NFL Films catalog than one might have imagined: because, in the long term, as those of us who remember the glory days faded into the sunset, all the younger generations will ever know firsthand will be the "New Coke," cheaper-to-produce, post-Sabols version of the franchise.

If that theory is valid, it is shameful beyond measure. Visionaries like Ed and Steve Sabol deserve to have their vision preserved as a living, evolving embodiment of the unique cultural phenomenon that the name of NFL Films embodies. Leveraging NFL.com as a fully-formed, multimedia encyclopedia of the league's history fits that bill, as does the revival of programming in the modern era of the classic style of filmmaking and storytelling that etched the entity squarely into the heart of American consciousness. The notion that NFL Films helped the league to become the most powerful one in North America is widely accepted, paving the way to the astronomical franchise values that owners enjoy today. Honoring both Sabols in the Hall of Fame is decades overdue. But paying them back for building the modern foundation of NFL cultural domination goes further than that. It must extend to putting out work that continues to innovate and entertain in the fashion that it once did.

## One Run-On Sentence For Each AFC Team

### AFC EAST

Buffalo: With a shaky running game and a few more holes defensively than most assume, they're still likely the top team in a tough division, but way overblown as a title contender.

Miami: For all of the likely excessive questioning of Tua — now that his passing game weapons are upgraded — it is the questionable running game and a still-incomplete offensive line that could relegate the Dolphins to second or third place.

New England: Even after an offseason spending spree that patched many holes — albeit at a cost that should compromise the salary cap in years to come — holes remain at wide receiver and linebacker and the question of when to start the clock on the future at quarterback lingers over this season.

New York Jets: With another shotgun marriage between coach and general manager, extreme youth at the skill positions and remaining holes defensively, it's going to be another long season at the Meadowlands.

### AFC NORTH

Cleveland: With the most complete starting 22 this side of Tampa, the Browns even have as much depth as is possible at many positions.

Baltimore: For all of the championship hype, Lamar Jackson remains guilty until proven innocent when behind in big games and the team is weaker than usual in the trenches on both sides of the ball.

Cincinnati: They still need help on the line, which is no small thing in terms of protecting Joe Burrow, and in the secondary, but even in the tough AFC they are a stealth playoff contender.

Pittsburgh: A noodle-armed quarterback and putrid offensive line place an undue burden on the defense, leading to a season that will resemble the stretch run of 2020.

### AFC SOUTH

Tennessee: Holes remain on defense, along with the one at tight end, rendering the extreme optimism in the aftermath of the Julio Jones acquisition extremely delusional.

Indianapolis: Carson Wentz is a huge question mark, but others loom on the offensive line, wide receiver and the back seven, leaving the championship of their weak division as the most likely route to the playoffs.

Jacksonville: Trevor Lawrence doesn't have the weapons that he needs in the passing game or on the offensive line — while the team does have a weird glut of high-end running backs — leading to a likely "Welcome to the NFL" season for Urban Meyer.

Houston: With or without DeShaun Watson, the ravaged post-Bill O'Brien roster has more holes than almost any team in the league, rendering them years away from even basic playoff contention.

### AFC WEST

Kansas City: With cap considerations looming, the defense has enough holes to threaten their necessary middle-of-the-pack status and wide receiver is thinner than usual — but with all of that said, the Chiefs still have a floor of making it to the divisional playoffs.

LA Chargers: There are still holes defensively, on the offensive line and in terms of passing game weapons, but there's enough high-end talent to justify playoff optimism.

Las Vegas: The defense needs help at all three levels and offensive line and wide receiver are not up to snuff, but this team is no stranger to overachieving to reach mediocrity, so the Raiders have a moderate chance to still be relevant at the start of December.

Denver: Quarterback remains the obvious question, especially playing in this division, but additional holes in the trenches on both sides of the ball and at linebacker are the true signs that the Broncos will remain in the middle of the rebuild that they refuse to admit that they are in.

Seattle: Russell Wilson is completely justified in any skepticism that he may feel about this roster, with linebacker the only position group on defense up to snuff, an offensive line that's been horrible since grunge music was in fashion, depth issues at running back and a complete sinkhole at tight end.

## NCAA Football Took A Long Time To Move To The Ideal System, Now Will Abandon It

For many years, I held perhaps the most unpopular opinion in America: that, contrary to the fondest wishes of seemingly everyone wanting a college football championship tournament, I just wanted the Plus-One. Semifinals, then a championship matchup of the winners and retention of the other bowl games.

During the Bowl Championship Series era of 1998-2013, this notion seemed as far-fetched as an actual tournament. Hiding their fealty to bowl game titans behind the sanctity of the regular season, the Powers That Be made change seem impossible – until the combination of the weight of years of controversies and the realization of how much extra money would be generated from a four-team playoff led to the system that we see today.

Unlike the huge-playoff advocates (i.e. again, most of America), I have always subscribed to the notion that NCAA football stands apart because the regular season has always been absolutely sacrosanct relative to national championship hopes. No other major sports federation in North America – and perhaps the entire world – could point to a system where the regular season would weed the field to a final two and the notion that, for top teams, “every game is a playoff game.” Even the Plus-One compromised this ideal, but ever so slightly and in ways justifiable, I thought, by the tradeoff of the added excitement and, yes, extra fairness of four top teams competing for the championship.

I contrast this reality to the Bizarro World equivalent of NCAA basketball, with a regular season that is as meaningless as it could be, culminating in admittedly a fabulous tournament. Think back to December 2009, when JerryWorld opened and home-state Texas battled another gargantuan power, the defending national champion North Carolina Tar Heels before more than 38,000 in attendance. Since the game would have no bearing on either team’s championship hopes, nobody really cared. And that’s your NCAA hoops regular season in a nutshell.

The football system has worked exceptionally well, I have felt, since 2014. Yes, there have been some lopsided games, but given the consolidation at the top of the NCAA, especially with Alabama, Clemson and Ohio State, that’s going to be inevitable. Way more often than not, the four best teams have been in the playoffs. The regular season still means as much as it possibly could for any competition with a playoff at the end of it.

And now, the next phase of the inevitable money grab kicks in, as the Powers That Be are apparently about to switch to a 12-team playoff in the next few years. Sure, there will be far fewer schools weeping about not being able to get into the playoffs, but I don’t think that reality is going to keep any of us warm at night when a 7-5 UCLA team invariably snakes the automatic Pac-12 bid. There will never again be a regular-season game that has the power to knock a previously unbeaten team out of contention for a championship. Will that be worth the rush of the two extra playoff rounds – which will now push the title game deep, deep into January and deep, deep past the natural rhythm of the season? I think not.

In this same vein, the bowl games outside the playoff are going to be completely worthless in this new reality. OurSportsCentral writer Fran Stuchbury even theorized on our program that, since they’re now going to be the equivalent – at best – of the NIT tournament in college basketball that some of them might as well align into their own tournament. That would at least restore some semblance of stakes in those games, even as they stand as a pale alternative to the tournament that so many have wanted for so long.

Additionally, with the NFL themselves moving deeper into February with the new 18-week regular season and playoff weekends colonized more than ever now that the wild card round features Saturday and Sunday tripleheaders, it will be amusing to see the mighty NCAA relegated to weeknights for their semifinals and championship. Still, this won’t be sufficient to stop the gluttony there. Further expansion to 16 teams or, God Forbid, 32 teams has been rendered plausible by this pandering surrender to Vox populi on the subject of expanded playoffs. Be careful what you wished for, America, because now we’re all going to get it.

## FDH College Rankings & Team Draft Guidelines

On the draft board, the numbers in parentheses are taken from a poll consensus. Take 6 owners and conduct a 7-round standard draft. Points will be assigned at 4 intervals: when the first College Football Playoff poll is released, when the third poll is released, when the final poll is released on December 5 and when the final AP poll is released after the national title game. The first CFT poll accounts for 20% of the total score (with the exception of the bonus points, mentioned below), the third CFT poll accounts for 20% of the total score, the December 5 poll accounts for 20% of the total score and the final AP poll accounts for 40% of the total score.

For the first three polls, scoring is as follows: 1st place (50 points), 2nd place (45 points), 3rd place (43 points), 4th place (42 points), 5th place (41 points), 6th place (38 points), 7th place (37 points), 8th place (36 points), 9th place (35 points), 10th place (34 points), 11th place (30 points), 12th place (29 points), 13th place (28 points), 14th place (27 points), 15th place (26 points), 16th place (22 points), 17th place (21 points), 18th place (20 points), 19th place (19 points), 20th place (18 points), 21st place (13 points), 22nd place (12 points), 23rd place (11 points), 24th place (10 points), 25th place (9 points).

Points are doubled in the final poll, since it accounts for twice the point total of each of the three previous ones. Additional bonuses are awarded for the following accomplishments:

25 points for winning the National Championship Game, 15 points for winning the national semifinals, 10 points for earning a spot in the semifinals, 10 points for a conference title (or piece of one, for conferences without a championship game), 12 points for winning a "Big 6" non-semifinal bowl game, 6 points for earning a spot in a "Big 6" non-semifinal bowl, 5 points for winning a non-"Big 6" bowl game and 10 points for having the Heisman Trophy winner on one of your teams.

There is another wrinkle, an additional level if you want more depth to the game. It's called the "Top 3" option, which awards points for finishing in the Top 3 of a conference division. 250 points go to the top team in a division (with 100 bonus points for the winner of the conference championship game), 150 points to the second-place team and 50 points to the third-place team. For teams in the Big 12 where there are no divisions, the point totals remain the same, but with 35 points for fourth place and 20 points for fifth place. Records are determined first by conference record, with overall record serving as a tiebreaker, with a tie being proclaimed anytime that both records are the same. Our projected standings for each conference are listed on Page 15.
