Pro Football Draft Overview

Hope Ya Don't Need Any QBs, All You NFL Teams!

Marketing-obsessed Roger Goodell must be losing sleep at the notion that the NFL's first Las Vegas draft (April 28-30, ESPN, ABC, NFL Network), coincides with one of the worst quarterback classes in recent decades. There have been a number of years in the 21st Century in which media geeks proclaim that there might not be a QB taken in the Top 10 picks, but Silly Season almost always elevates (almost always unworthy) passers to that level – considering that 2000 and 2013 are the only years in this time period where the first quarterback slipped past #10. Nobody in this draft class, at the game's most important position – is can't-miss enough for the Top 10, but desperate teams could well talk themselves into Malik Willis of Liberty or Pittsburgh's Kenny Pickett. Matt Corral of Mississippi and Sam Howell of North Carolina could also slip into the first round.

Edge superstars Aidan Hutchinson of Michigan and Kayvon Thibodeaux of Oregon have loomed at or near the top of draft boards dating back to the

start of the last college football season. They anchor one of the draft's deepest positions, along with Jermaine Johnson II of Florida State and George Karlaftis of Purdue. Travon Walker of Georgia, who could play inside or outside on the defensive line under certain circumstances, is also noteworthy.

Some of the greatest WR draft classes of all time have come since 2014 (after a drought dating back to 1996) and this one stacks up as well, headlined by Garrett Wilson and Chris Olave of Ohio State, (the rehabilitating) Jameson Williams of Alabama, Drake London of USC, Treyton Burks of Arkansas and George Pickens of Georgia. OT is another elite position, exemplified by Evan Neal of Alabama, Ikem Ekwonu of North Carolina State, Charles Cross of Mississippi State, Trevor Penning of Northern Iowa and Bernhard Raimann of Central Michigan. The other top-notch group is at CB, with Derek Stingley, Jr of LSU, Ahmad Gardner of Cincinnati, Andrew Booth of Clemson, Trent McDuffie of Washington and Roger McCreary of Auburn as the most noteworthy.

Other players who could be selected very high on Day One include Notre Dame S Kyle Hamilton, Iowa C Tyler Linderbaum and Georgia LB Nakobe Dean.

First Look Ahead to 2023 Pro Football Draft

Coming off of one of the worst NFL Draft QB classes in recent decades, 2023 promises a tremendous rebound with dual-threat passers CJ Stroud of Ohio State and Bryce Young of Alabama. Florida's Anthony Richardson has a chance to join them on that top level.

Also likely in the Top 10, unusual in this day and age due to his immense skill set, is likely to be Texas RB Bijan Robinson. Other elite skill position prospects include WRs Jaxon Smith-Njigba of Ohio State, Jordan Addison of Pittsburgh, Parker Washington of Penn State and TE Michael Mayer of Notre Dame. Up front offensively, Ohio State OT/OG Paris Johnson looms above the rest.

On the edge, Will Anderson of Alabama, BJ Ojulari of LSU and Habukkuk Baldanad of Pittsburgh will be highly coveted. Clemson has a pair of highly-skilled disruptors in the trenches, Bryan Bresee and Myles Murphy.

The secondary boasts a deep crop, with Malachi Moore of Alabama, Kelee Ringo of Georgia, Joey Porter, Jr. of Penn State, Brandon Joseph of Northwestern and Tony Grimes of North Carolina.

Draft Play-Along Game

We at FantasyDrafthelp.com have devised a contest to help you and your friends measure your acumen on Draft Day. It's the FantasyDrafthelp.com Mock Draft Game (credit to Fantasy Drafthelp.com contributor Bob Benak for inventing the game). Each participant submits a mock draft before the proceedings ... and then all parties compete in a separate "live draft competition."

Each board is scored separately, but the scores of the two are compiled to crown the Grand Champion of Draft Day. Here's the scoring system:

Picks #1-4 are weighted at one point apiece.

Picks #5-8 are weighted at two points apiece.

Picks #9-12 are weighted at three points apiece.

Picks #13-16 are weighted at four points apiece.

Picks #17-20 are weighted at five points apiece.

Picks #21-24 are weighted at six points apiece.

Picks #25-28 are weighted at seven points apiece.

Picks #29-32 are weighted at eight points apiece

Players may "roll over" their picks from the completed mock draft to the live draft if a player remains on the board ... or they may cover themselves with another pick. Example: a player has Atlanta taking Garrett Wilson with the #8 pick on the mock draft they turned in at the outset. That would count for two points if the pick is correct. If Wilson is still on the board when the Lions are on the clock, the player is not obligated to pick Wilson during the live draft. He may "roll over" the pick, choosing to try to win two points in both the live and completed mock draft categories. Or he may try to cover himself with another pick. For example, should he correctly pick Malik Willis in the live draft part of the competition, he would gain the two points in the live draft but win no points in the completed mock draft part of the competition, in which he incorrectly picked Wilson. So strategy is at a premium during this competition. This game also puts great emphasis on correctly making picks later in the first round, when chances for success are the most difficult. Picking a player accurately in the later part of the first round on both the completed mock draft and the live mock draft can ensure a thrilling, come-from-behind victory. If you and your friends want to take your enjoyment of Draft Day to the next level by competing and strategizing along with the wizards of the NFL, try our game and enjoy!

2022 Rookie Class Fantasy Analysis

Long story short: this is one of the very worst rookie draft classes from a fantasy perspective. Every top QB is a project at best and thus none of them will be a statistical factor in 2022. There are no big studs at TE, either. The RB class is thin, with only Kenneth Walker III of Michigan State, Breece Hall of Iowa State and Isaiah Spiller of Texas A&M appearing to have decent time-share potential at present.

That leaves the WR class, which is truly outstanding. It is highlighted by Garrett Wilson and Chris Olave of Ohio State, (the rehabilitating) Jameson Williams of Alabama, Drake London of USC, Treyton Burks of Arkansas and George Pickens of Georgia. Jason Jones's Breakdown Of An Outstanding Wide Receiver Class

First of all, here's how I have them slotted: Garrett Wilson, Jameson Williams, Chris Olave, Drake London, Jahan Dotson, Christian Watson, Treyton Burks, Skyy Moore.

Jameson is ahead of schedule and should be full speed between training camp and October 1 and I never base draft picks or their positional rankings off of this year only I almost want to say he feels like Tyreek Hill when doing fast guy stuff: slipping behind defenders, burning guys with long speed, being way more open than they should be. But he's not as dynamic a pass catcher as Hill is. I was just reminded after the trade just how good Hill is as just a handsy receiver.

Garrett Wilson has that dynamic IT that Hill does. Garrett feels like all of the great atypical receivers out now. Like he's a little Tyreek Hill, a little Cooper Kupp, a little Stefon Diggs, a little Odell, etc. I wish I could say Ja'Marr Chase but light in the ass, but I think that's a stretch.

Chris Olave is REALLY interesting. I don't think it's a stretch to say Chris Olave is the AJ Green of this draft. If you want smooth, great hands, solid awareness, straight-line speed in the prototypical frame, Olave's your guy.

Drake London's physical traits keep me from dropping him out of the first tier. I like that he can truck just about anyone. He's got good hands for a big guy. My hesitation is people acting like he's DK Metcalf. London isn't chasing a DB down from behind in a footrace. They are the same prospect, but he plays WR like a PF. You can be successful at that. He's not even Mike Evans yet as a "receiver." He's seems to have one basic speed. He's not slow, but at times it looks that way on tape. So my first thing when anyone brings him up is "get Megatron out of your head immediately." I think he'd be great as a projected WR1 for a punishing running team. I think he'd be great in Tennessee, but less effective in Jacksonville.

Jahan Dotson feels like Chris Olave-lite. Or a more crafty Chris Olave: not as fast or as quick, hands are pretty close, similar route runners. I'm confident that he could do the entire route tree. Olave is just a little better everywhere. Olave's ceiling could be a good-to-great-WR1, whereas Dotson is more like a top 10 WR2 or an adequate WR1 on a bad team until you can someone faster, stronger, more dynamic.

Skyy Moore is nice, but I think that he's scheme-specific, this year's small combine star pick. I like him, but he's somewhere between a fast Welker and Brandin Cooks.

Christian Watson as a prospect is REALLY intriguing. He's faster and quicker than he should be and his tape is better than I expected. He might be the only tall guy that I'm intrigued with.

Treyton Burks scares the crap out of me... I like his balance, how he uses his size, how he has moves in certain situations that make you perk up. But he has A LOT of Brayton Edwards-like tendencies. He catches with his arms entirely too much for my liking. I haven't seen much of him operating in traffic. He's always significantly open. I don't think that I've ever seen him battle for a contested ball or outcatch a good DB in position. The 4.55 is concerning.

I also want to introduce George Pickens into this conversation, maybe even as high as the Drake London-Jahan Dotson range. Short version, he is roughly prototype-sized, does all the things I like, is stronger than he looks, is a very good blocker, and has this OBJ/Tyreek thing where he isn't afraid to lay out or take weird body angles to make catches. And he's surprisingly successful at it. I'll have to look closer and find out what's wrong with him. If he ran in the 4.3s, then I'd put him up there with Olave. So prospect wise, if Olave is AJ Green, Pickens is Chase Claypool.

Why Value Matters In Fantasy & Pro Sports Drafts

On our FANTASYDRAFTHelp.COM INSIDER webcasts, we've discussed this point many times, but we're continually reminded of the need to readdress it: the very real link between fantasy sports drafts and the so-called real kind.

Years ago, when the Buffalo Bills selected Donte Whitner with the eighth overall pick at a time when he was considered a fringe Top 20 player at best, FDH Senior Editor Jason Jones and I ridiculed the pick in a real-time webcast.

We explained that Marv Levy, who was new to the Buffalo front office, clearly had no concept of value. Top 10 picks must become franchise players at their positions. If, for whatever reason, you are fixated on a player unworthy of the draft slot, trade back and obtain the value collectively, through the desired player and additional picks, but always get value for your pick.

And if a Top 10 pick must become a franchise player, then a Top 5 pick must become one of the elite players in the league. For a team like the Browns that squandered numerous draft picks under the auspices of such luminaries as Butch Davis, Shoebox Pete Garcia, Eric Mangini, Mike Lombardi, Ray Farmer and Sashi Brown, the tenth overall pick in the draft has to be a home run and cannot be used on a player not deemed safe enough by the collective brainpower of NFL personnel people. There is no margin for error.

We at FDH don't have to educate skilled fantasy sports owners on the concept of value. This is something they know, or at the very least intuit, as they go through their draft or auction preparation. We always say that you win by obtaining value with every pick. While that ideal is almost impossible, you have to come as close as you can. That means that your high picks have to perform at the level forecasted and your mid-round and lower-round picks must outperform their draft slots. We have always emphasized that the same precept holds true in professional sports drafts. Winning organizations make the most of their draft picks and they know how to proceed in a measured fashion. They do not panic.
