Three Huge Options At The Top Of The Draft With A Sizable Second Tier Of Promise

Technically, only Orlando won the lottery this year, but in reality Oklahoma City and Houston did as well. Think back to last year when Cleveland and Toronto ended up with Evan Mobley and Scottie Barnes, respectively. This year, the first three will contain some combination of the following players: Auburn combo forward Jabari Smith (off-compared to Kevin Durant), Gonzaga PF/C Chet Holmgren (the most well-rounded big man in the draft and one of the best of the past few decades) and Duke PF/C Paolo Banchero (possessing a swank offensive game).

The second tier is deeper than usual, extending most of the way through the lottery. Notably, the Big Ten produced three rare specimens, sophomores who progressed greatly from their freshman seasons: Iowa PF Keegan Murray, Wisconsin SG Johnny Davis and Purdue PG/SG Jaden Ivey. Most of the rest of this tier hails from the sport's blue blood programs: PG TyTy Washington and SG Shaedon Sharpe (a mysterious high-upside prospect who has not played since high school), Kansas SG Ochai Agbaji, Arizona swingman Benedict Mathurin and Duke SF AJ Griffin. Ohio State swingman Malaki Branham rounds out the crop.

THE TOP 75 PLAYERS IN PRO BASKETBALL HISTORY

The NBA's 75th Anniversary has prompted a wave of Best-Of lists, but few with the substance to reinforce the selections. Authors Rick Morris, Ben Chew and Russ Cohen came together to create a list of the top 75 pro basketball players ever, with evidence to justify the placement of each -- as well as biographical details, comparisons of various legends, little-known-but-interesting tidbits, what-if scenarios and much more. Additionally, the book includes our year-by-year ranking of the top players in pro basketball and rosters for hypothetical "Olympic Dream Teams" had they existed prior to 1992. Preview Of FantasyDrafthelp.com Ultimate Fantasy Hoops Stat For 2021-22 Season

This is the FantasyDrafthelp.com statistic, the Ultimate Quantitative Baseline, based on the statistical principle of standard deviation from the mean. We utilize the standard fantasy categories: PPG, RPG, APG, ST, BL, TO, FG%, FT% and 3%. In each category, a spectrum is calculated from the best performance to the worst on a per-game basis. The numbers in each category are added together to create our statistic. An additional equalizer is injected to apply more points to each player at the positions of scarcer depth. What this stat truly does is to quantify beyond doubt how the stronger and weaker performances in each category add up to the absolute fantasy value for each player. As such, it establishes a baseline for performance that is more comprehensive than anything ever developed. A number over 1000 is considered elite. We have listed below the top 25 forwards and guards, top 15 centers and top 50 overall.

Breaking Down The Sports Realism In 'Winning Time

Sports movies and shows must be realistic. If they're not, they can ruin it for me. The actor Solomon Hughes, who portrays Kareem Abdul-Jabbar in Winning Time, was the key factor regarding this: if he had a bad skyhook. In my eyes, it was and still is the most unstoppable shot in the history of the NBA. The dynamic between Kareem and Magic is fascinating.

"Dr. Solomon Hughes already brings this elevated presence when he's around. So for me, I wanted to bring something different, more playful, and childlike. I am playing a 20-year-old. Solomon is a father. He's the grown-up in the room," said Quincy Isaiah, who plays Magic Johnson perfectly.

Hughes chimed in as well. "Numbers back it up as far as the skyhook. You got it right," Hughes told me. "He has an Mt. Everest record shooting a two-pointer. I totally agree. Perfectly, he's the one that took it to that form. I shot it religiously. At the park, at 24/7 fitness. Older gentleman would nod with approval. Whoever criticizes me, I'll hand them the ball and ask them to do it."

Magic vs. Nixon

Both are important players in this movie. Quincy has every mannerism of Magic Johnson down pat. He's 100% believable and his play is good. DeVaughn Nixon is a perfect Norm for obvious reasons. When Nixon and Magic are going one-on-one at one point, it was very interesting and well-played by both actors. "It was a little bit of hazing for Magic. Norm controlled the fraternity. Kids were coming in, and he had to show them what was up. In real life, speaking to my father, he respected the talent, who he was, and I never think my dad feared for his job because he put up numbers. He just had to figure out how they would all gel together. I enjoyed beating up on Quincy (chuckles)."

The coaching perspectives in this movie were great. Adrien Brody plays Pat Riley and played him perfectly, showing his full intensity. "I try to be chill and apply a levelheadedness in real life. That comes with age. I was much more intense when I was younger. It was easy to tap into that. With sport, you win or you lose. You're in or you're out. Second-best isn't acceptable. You want to win."

And Jason Segel had a very hard role, in my estimation, showing the weirdness of Paul Westhead. He was a fixture at LaSalle in Philadelphia and moved west to be the assistant coach of the Lakers. "The way that I played it, which is all I know, is this guy, when you dedicate your life to a sport it is everything to you. It's who you are, and a line was 'they took my whistle and stuck me behind a desk. 'That phone call from Jack was somebody getting their life back,' Segel explained.

Hadley Robinson is the breakout star in this. She plays Jeanie Buss. She becomes a very integral character over time, but in the beginning, wasn't being taken seriously by her father or grandmother. "She does eavesdrop quite a bit. She's very much the fly on the wall, but I think it's for business reasons and personal. There's so much they don't tell her. And she's out of the loop. They treat her like a little girl and she was coming into her own," said Robinson. "She used it to her advantage, but it could have been misused too."

Just to get this out of the way, none of the big-name players on "buyer's remorse" contracts are going to fail to pick up their player options: Russell Westbrook, James Harden, John Wall and Kyrie Irving. Conversely, Bradley Beal can make a ton of money even if he moves on from DC – although they hold his Bird rights, so any relocation could be via sign-and-trade.

The sole member of the free agency class essentially on Beal's level is Zach LeVine. Deandre Ayton probably played his way out of a max deal with Phoenix, but all it takes is one team willing to pay him that.

The best of the rest unrestricted free agents are high-level role players, such as Gary Harris, Ricky Rubio, Andre Iguodala, Jusuf Nurcic, TJ Warren, PJ Tucker, Joe Ingles, Marvin Bagley and Kevon Looney.

Restricted free agents are usually not that interesting, because the best ones are almost always retained by their incumbent teams, but the situation with Collin Sexton and Cleveland certainly bears watching.

‘Winning Time’ Will Change Small Screen Sports Storytelling

John C. Reilly has played a ton of great parts in his career. I loved him in Bull Durham. In ‘Winning Time’, he plays businessman, father, and playboy, Dr. Jerry Buss, who owned the Los Angeles Lakers at the time they drafted Earvin ‘Magic’ Johnson. Buss had a good side and what I called a smarmy side, and Reilly talked about that in a recent interview. “When I was offered this part, it was seven days before the pilot started shooting,” Reilly admitted. “I came in very late in the process, but I knew Adam McKay would have my back, and it’s somebody I really trusted and had great success with, in the past. Ya know, that smarminess, it’s funny. If you looked at the facts of his life, he had these certain hedonistic habits like a lot of people in the basketball world. The most telling thing to me with Jerry Buss, and his whole way, and I tried to be as sensitive as I could be to his family, while trying to tell the truth or at least some version of the truth about what happened. The smarminess when you get that much power and success. It happens with actors all the time. Eventually, someone starts bringing you coffee, and you just feel like you’re someone who deserves to be brought coffee. It’s not a character flaw, it’s just an acknowledgment of reality. People treat you this way and you guess that’s just the way it is. People treated Jerry like Hugh Hefner, who was one of his friends. To me, the most telling thing about Jerry Buss is when you look at his memorial. For all those women he dated for all those years, all the players and all the people he did business with, every single one of them loved that guy.”

Reilly explained that perfectly. And that’s a big reason why I loved the series. It’s about the details. And so the reader doesn’t miss any of them. Buss thought of the Lakers as a family, and the family dynamic in this series was interesting. It was messed up at times, but it centers around Jerry’s mother, Jessie Buss, who did the books for Buss. The incomparable Sally Field played this character to its fullest, as she does with everything that she plays. Viewers are going to love the wardrobe. “The exterior of Jessie is a big part of it,” Field explained. “There were outrageous clothes and the jewelry and the hair and fingernails. I worked on the physicality in her voice. She’s a drinker and a smoker. She’s got some toughness about her. She’s a survivor. The crew would always wait for me to come on set and see what I was wearing like ‘OMG, here we go.’ Each outfit was topping the last one. As Stanislavsky would say, that’s part of creating a character. Create the exterior before you create the interior. That was helpful.”

Field is a Lakers season ticket holder and a massive fan! “It was the Lakers games. It’s what we did together as a family. I was there. I watched Magic at this time. I watched Kareem. We watched the evolution of all of it. I watched young Kobe when he was in the arena for the first time. My two oldest boys would go. My youngest son may be the world’s biggest Lakers fan. When a game is on, we all text each other. This was a big, big, part of my life.”

As We Predicted, More Room At The Top In The 2020s

As noted in this space a year ago, here’s the number of different teams represented in the NBA Finals each decade: eight in the 1950s, five in the 1960s, 10 in the 1970s, five in the 1980s, 10 in the 1990s, 12 in the 2000s and nine in the 2010s. We forecast an era in the 2020s with more (relative) parity at the top as top teams from the 2010s are still hanging around as new powers are emerging in the 2020s. This year’s NBA Finals reflected this dynamic with Golden State as a holdover team and young Boston breaking through. And there are now six different teams already represented in the Finals this decade (surpassing the 1960s and 1980s already) – the first three-year stretch with six different teams in the Finals since 2006-08 and only the second since 1976-78!

The post-LeBron teams in Miami and Cleveland, although both strong contenders again, bear no resemblance to the teams that he led to the Finals, so they count as fresh faces. Toronto is the only champion from the East in the 2010s that is even partially intact, with Milwaukee taking the 2021 title and Boston, Brooklyn and Philadelphia among the teams looking to break through.

Golden State is the big carryover in the West from the 2010s, with the Lakers taking the title in 2020 and Phoenix, Dallas, Denver, Utah, Memphis and the LA Clippers looming as significant teams. This slow-motion changing of the guard between the stars of the 2010s and the 2020s, which probably started as far back as the Orlando bubble, is ongoing and fueling one of the most exciting periods in the history of the league.

The Cavs Are At The Intersection Of Player Development And The Process

[NOTE: Admittedly, I have written disproportionately about my hometown Cleveland Cavaliers in this space over the years, but through their successes and failures, they continue to provide more relevant lessons about how to build, maintain and rebuild than almost any other team in the 21st Century.]

In today's NBA, most teams at a marginal playoff level or worse are adherents of one of two approaches: Player Development (with San Antonio, Denver and post-LeBron Miami as the most notable examples) and The Process (most famously pursued by Philadelphia). Rarely can it be said that both approaches have congealed into a unified path for a team, but this is indeed the case on America's North Coast.

Of course, when you achieve that convergence, you need to be lucky as well as good and the Cavs have been above-average in that regard since LeBron left for the first time in 2010. Both that time and The Departure Part Deux in 2018 saw Cavs owner Dan Gilbert go balls-out to avoid the cleansing suck process that could lead the team back to glory. Fortunately, both times, the team sucked anyway, avoiding the ceiling of first-round-elimination-Purgatory that franchises such as Chicago currently occupy.

In the Years Between LeBron Eras, Kyrie Irving (acquired with a lottery pick obtained in the genius Baron Davis trade) and Andrew Wiggins (flipped to obtain Kevin Love) provided the foundation for a Big Three with LeBron and were the roses that grew through the manure of painful basketball. Gilbert's vision of pairing stars with LeBron bore fruit spectacularly, but it was clear in 2018 that the trajectory of LBJ's career would not allow for a repeat, even if he eyed a second return at some point.

The Cavs got a head start on the rebuild with the Kyrie trade bringing back a 2018 lottery pick. Collin Sexton, like the 2019 selection Darius Garland, came out as a gifted-but-developing talent. Picking eighth and fifth, respectively, did not place the Cavs in position for a can't-miss star, nor did the fifth pick in 2020, Isaac Okoro — a defensive stopper still struggling to build an NBA-caliber offensive game.

But then came 2021, the year that changed the trajectory of the franchise and set the stage for the team to rocket up the standings the following season (with the shocking likelihood of a top-four seed before a crippling avalanche of injuries).

In the winter of 2021, the famous deal that sent James Harden to Brooklyn necessitated offloading Jarrett Allen and his salary to Cleveland, where his game reached new levels. Over the summer, the Cavs also acquired sweet-shooting big man Lauri Markkanen and resolved to give him more of a chance than the Bulls did. These two, as well as Sexton and Garland, have served as developmental success stories — as have players further down the bench, such as "Junkyard Dog" Lamar Stevens and Dean Wade.

But the NBA Draft Lottery brought the crucial element of "The Process" into the equation. Securing a "unicorn" such as Evan Mobley changed the game altogether, adding THE player to build around, one who is already being compared to such greats as Kevin Garnett, Chris Bosh and Anthony Davis.

Veteran leadership was provided by a re-energized Love, as well as Ricky Rubio and Rajon Rondo and a deadline trade for Caris LeVert added scoring punch and helped compensate for the aforementioned injuries. Love and LeVert are each signed for one more season, with LeVert being a strong candidate for an extension and free agent Sexton an equally strong candidate to return — as is Rubio, who unfortunately will miss a chunk of the 2022-23 season as he recovers from his ACL injury. The pain of losing in the play-in round shifted to the pleasant realization of being able to add another rotation player to the mix with the 14th pick in the draft that is now not being shipped this year to Indiana in the LeVert deal.

At this point, the question can legitimately be asked: medium-term and long-term, who would you rather be than the Cavs? Mobley has as bright a future as anyone in the game, as his skills are merged with an insatiable desire for self-improvement that leads to rapid progress. Garland and Allen were justifiably All-Stars this past winter and much of the rest of the rotation can be penciled in without sacrificing quality in any area. And the unselfish culture preached by JB Bickerstaff, Love, Rubio and Rondo rubbed off on the young stars, who are all unselfish and team-oriented by nature. The joy that they take in each other's successes is by no means commonplace in The Association.

Best of all, expiring salaries combined with Bird rights will allow the Cavs to keep EVERYONE that they deem essential provided that luxury taxes are no barrier — and Gilbert has always been fearless in that regard before with the justifiable reasoning that the fan support accorded to a champion makes up the difference financially.

The basketball intelligentsia never tires of droning on about the futility of replacing a megastar and about how the Cavs, were it not for the geographical accident of being close to LeBron's hometown of Akron, would have been no exception to the rule post-2014. But there can be no asterisk placed on what is happening in Cleveland this time around. There's actually been less luck involved than there was from 2010-14, when the Cavs managed a whopping three top overall picks in four years. Not every move has worked out, such as the drafting/trading of Kevin Porter Jr and the coaches that the team cycled through before Bickerstaff. But by keeping their mistakes manageable, developing star and bench players alike and being in the right place at the right time to draft Mobley, the Cavs are making a strong case that the colors of the future are Wine and Gold.
