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Draft Board Decoder

The FantasyDrafthelp.com draft board contains all the relevant information you need right at your fingertips. For example, in terms of QB, RB, WR and TE:

^ Players are color-coded by their value by round in a 12-team draft. 1st round is gold, 2nd round silver, 3rd round bronze, 4th round orange and 5th round light blue.

^ \$ denotes the dollar value in auction leagues.

^ The "Exp" column displays where each player placed in an "experts consensus board" of top fantasy magazines and websites.

^ The "Stat" column shows how each player performed on our standard deviation from the mean statistic in 2023 (stat details on Page 4).

^ 2023 yardage and TD totals are listed, along with rankings for each and rankings in the aforementioned "Stat" category. Also, on the WR and TE boards, "Ctch%" measures the completion percentage of targets to each player. Rushing yards for quarterbacks and receiving yards for running backs are also listed.

^ "Bye" denotes each player's bye week.

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FantasyDrafthelp.com Suggested League Guidelines

Many leagues start 1 QB, 2 RB, 2 WR, 1 TE, 1 K and some D/ST combination. Some leagues allow the TE position to be WR or TE (in which case, only a few TEs merit any consideration) and some have a "flex" position, which is generally 1 additional RB or WR. With leagues who utilize defense, some deploy a team D/ST unit and some use individual D players.

The most common scoring system is a variation of the following: 4 points per passing TD, 1 point per 25 yards passing, 1 point per passing 2-point PAT, 6 points per receiving or rushing TD, 1 point per 10 yards rushing or receiving, 2 points per rushing or receiving 2-point PAT, 2 points per "big play touchdown" (50 or more yards), 1 point per kicking PAT, 3 points per FG, with a 1-point bonus at 45 yards, a 2-point bonus at 50 yards and a 3-point bonus at 55 yards, 6 points per defensive or special teams TD, 1 point per interception, sack or fumble recovered and 2 points per safety. In leagues that award 6 points for passing TDs, QBs are worth much more.

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Evaluating Production Across a Spectrum: Lessons of "The Stat"

Our "Stat" category on our draft board calculates the standard deviation from the mean in all statistical categories.

In simple English, imagine a spectrum going across from left to right, with negative numbers on the left side, a "zero" in the middle and positive numbers on the right side. We utilize this statistic for baseball, basketball, hockey and NASCAR as well as football. A player's performance in each category is plotted on one of these spectrums, with the most valuable players putting up most of their numbers on the most of their numbers on the positive side. Then, we add up the totals of every category, positive and negative. By using this tool, we can identify not merely how they performed, but how valuable their performances were in each category. Truly, this statistic serves as the ultimate baseline for the previous season's production.

^ Don't be that guy who is unprepared and whines in the mid to late rounds that everyone worth taking is already gone. They're not; you're just unprepared.

^ Don't be that guy who doesn't properly understand your league's scoring system. League setups are like snowflakes; no two are the same. Our draft board is configured to conform to a fairly basic scoring system, but your league could have some quirks that would force you to make adaptations to our board. Be aware.

^ Don't be that guy who doesn't pay enough attention and selects players who are already off the board. It's impolite to your leaguemates and it will invariably break your concentration when everyone howls at you and you've got to go back to Square One on a backup pick. To ensure that you are aware of everything that is going on during your draft, utilize a "grid" to track all teams, with the number of rounds going down the left side and the teams listed along the top.

^ Don't be that guy who approaches the draft like it's a night of epic decision-making. If you've done your homework, it's not. You merely find out where you're drafting and you "let the draft come to you."

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2024 Fantasy Overview

^ The first and second tiers at RB are shallower than in 2024, as teams continue to devalue the position and positional studs like Nick Chubb and Austin Ekeler come into this season devalued. The fourth and fifth tiers are thinner as well, meaning that you need to strongly prioritize getting your second running back by the third round – keeping in mind that we rarely deal in absolutes and strongly prefer the "let the draft come to you" approach, so we are very serious about this year being the exception to the rule – considering ...

^ The strong depth at WR is almost unprecedented. After years and years of incredible draft classes and the present default style of wide-open offense in the league, the first level is actually somewhat thinner, but the second level is perhaps the largest one that we've ever had in any sport, 20 spots! The total number of draftable receivers is actually the same as 2023, though.

^ The top tier at QB is deeper than last year, with 11 passers, meaning that almost everyone in a 12-team league can get one. And considering that our tier is rounded out by the two QBs who tied for 3rd in our UQB statistic a year ago, Jared Goff and Brock Purdy, there is not a world of difference from the top to the bottom of the level. Draft accordingly. The second tier ends at the same point as a year ago, but the third tier is actually a tad shallower.

^ It's incredibly premature to proclaim this as the golden age of TEs, but we have an unusually large top tier that is 10 deep. Going all the way back to the inception of this guide in 2008, we've only had a top tier that large once, in 2010 and only once with 9 tight ends, in 2019. Now, a word of caution, in neither year previously did the top tier deliver as we expected, but there just doesn't seem to be a whole lot in terms of separation among the top ones – unless Sam LaPorta takes another step in his rise and/or unless Travis Kelce bounces back. The second tier is a shade deeper and the third tier is somewhat shorter.

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2025 NFL Draft Preview

The 2025 NFL Draft has two strong candidates to be the top pick in the draft presently, given the position that generally occupies that spot: QBs Shedeur Sanders of Colorado and Quinn Ewers of Texas. And it should be no surprise that in this era of NIL, the transfer portal and the rich getting richer in terms of the top programs, most of the candidates to go in the top half of the first round have teammates who could very well join them there. The other Buffalo, of course, is dynamic potential two-way player CB/WR Travis Hunter and the other Longhorns are OT/OG Kelvin Banks and DE Ethan Burke.

The only candidates to go in the Top 16 who don't have teammates presently likely to join them are DE Landon Jackson of Arkansas, DE Patrick Payton of Florida State, CB Benjamin Morrison of Notre Dame and WR Luther Burden III of Missouri. 1 DeShaun Watson. He has to prove that he can stay healthy, stay out of trouble and take the Browns back to the playoffs when Joe Flacco came off his couch last winter and instantly became the franchise's most popular QB since Bernie Kosar. No pressure.

2 Harrison Butker. He is not indicative of the wave of entitlement coming off of the back-to-back titles that Rashee Rice, Wanya Morris and Chukwuebuka Godrick are presently embodying with their arrests, but his insertion into the culture wars may cause lefty Chief fans to root against him and no team can afford chaos in the kicker spot. Will the Swifties tolerate his continued presence on the team?

3 Tua Tagovailoa. The Dolphins did not have a great offseason in terms of addressing their needs, to put it mildly, so Tua playing at an absolute MVP level is the sole scenario that would see the Fish make a deep playoff run.

9 Derrick Barnes. The Lions no longer have many needs defensively, but they're going to have one at linebacker until he gets back to 100% after last year's knee injury in the NFC Championship Game.

10 Henry To'oTo'o. The Texans are almost impeccable on defense at this point, but this linebacker spot is the one question mark right now.

FDH College Rankings & Team Draft Guidelines

On the draft board, the numbers in parentheses are taken from a poll consensus. Take 6 owners and conduct a 7-round standard draft. Points will be assigned at 4 intervals: when the first College Football Playoff poll is released, when the third poll is released, when the final poll is released on December 3 and when the final AP poll is released after the national title game. The first CFT poll accounts for 20% of the total score (with the exception of the bonus points, mentioned below), the third CFT poll accounts for 20% of the total score, the December 8 poll accounts for 20% of the total score and the final AP poll accounts for 40% of the total score.

For the first three polls, scoring is as follows: 1st place (50 points), 2nd place (45 points), 3rd place (43 points), 4th place (42 points), 5th place (41 points), 6th place (38 points), 7th place (37 points), 8th place (36 points), 9th place (35 points), 10th place (34 points), 11th place (30 points), 12th place (29 points), 13th place (28 points), 14th place (27 points), 15th place (26 points), 16th place (22 points), 17th place (21 points), 18th place (20 points), 19th place (19 points), 20th place (18 points), 21st place (13 points), 22nd place (12 points), 23rd place (11 points), 24th place (10 points), 25th place (9 points).

Points are doubled in the final poll, since it accounts for twice the point total of each of the three previous ones.

Additional bonuses are awarded for the following accomplishments:

35 points for winning the National Championship Game, 20 points for winning the national semifinals, 25 points for a conference title (or piece of one, for conferences without a championship game), 15 points for winning a quarterfinal bowl game, 10 points for winning a first-round playoff game, 5 points for winning a non-playoff bowl game and 10 points for having the Heisman Trophy winner on one of your teams.

Buffalo: It looked like the team was going to have to take a knee for at least a season to retool on the fly when they came up short again last season, then they had to make several difficult cap decisions, albeit the team had a good draft and benefitted from Miami failing to take a step up in the offseason, albeit the Bills are still a bit thin in the back seven and may need some time to settle in at WR.

Miami: They are the former future 2024 AFC East Champions, losing Christian Wilkins and coming out of the offseason with a number of holes on both sides of the ball, squarely fumbling the chance to surpass the Bills in the division and putting Mike McDaniel behind the eight-ball in his third season.

New York Jets: IF Aaron Rodgers is both healthy and not washed – and the chances of being two-for-two on that front may not be great – then this roster is definitely playoff-worthy, even in a tough division.

New England: The depleted roster that Bill Belichick left behind has less holes than most pundits perceive right now, but there are quite a number of spots where the starters are competent but not much better, leaving too few positions filled by impact players.

AFC NORTH

Cincinnati: It's shocking how many pundits are sleeping on a Super Bowl favorite from a year ago, considering how they overachieved in Joe Brrr's absence and considering that they don't have many craters on the roster, albeit the running game could be a bit weaker than it was even with a diminished Joe Mixon last year.

Cleveland: Last year bore out our belief that the team had less holes than most teams in the league – and the bench depth was better than expected, since the team weathered a wave of injuries to make the playoffs – but the team is going to live or die by Deshaun Watson's ability to stay out of trouble, stay healthy and prove that he's still on par with the dominant quarterback of his Houston years.

Baltimore: The offensive line may not be up to usual Raven standards, the WR depth is questionable and the back seven has some holes, rendering this team further away from a Super Bowl trip than their AFC Championship appearance would have you believe.

Pittsburgh: Picking up both Russell Wilson and Justin Fields was a head-scratcher – and a bigger head-scratcher was not picking up Fields's fifth-year option, meaning that he seems to have one foot out the door already since he won't be starting and need not take a back seat to this version of Wilson – but at least the team solved their crappy QB situation and actually did the best job that they have done in the better part of a decade in filling their starting 22.

AFC SOUTH

Houston: The game's next great power has the franchise QB, a deep WR core and the best two-year job of filling a roster in the NFL, but is forced to contend with the game's fastest-rising division, which we forecast that it would be a year ago.

Jacksonville: A disappointing follow-up to their 2022 South title and a good first half to the next season leaves the Jags in a bit of limbo, with concerns on the offensive line and back seven.

Indianapolis: The start of the Anthony Richardson era is encouraging, as is the level of coaching seen in 2023, but the team may end up having to win some shootouts with the state of the back seven.

Tennessee: If Will Levis is somehow for real (although he probably isn't), then the Titans will challenge for the playoffs as early as this season, with the roster having been reinforced during a strong offseason, leaving the back seven as the weakest link.

AFC WEST

Kansas City: Thinking back to teams such as New England in 2005, Dallas in 1994, San Francisco in 1990 and Pittsburgh in 1980 and 1976 (leaving aside Denver in 1999 without John Elway), it's very, very rare to see a two-time Super Bowl champion returning in stronger fashion for their run at a three-peat, but these Chiefs are exactly that, but the legal status of Rashee Rice could keep this team from running away with the pack and the fact that others on the team are having brushes with the law could trip up this team for some of the same reasons as Dallas in 1994 with the entitled attitudes.

Los Angeles Chargers: We said a year ago that the Chargers had more holes than most people would have thought, and their collapse proved that, but they upgraded their coaching and the overall roster in the offseason, albeit the turnover at WR could lead to a difficult start to the year.

Denver: This is a team in a weird – and pretty bad – spot after absorbing the devastation of the Russell Wilson buyout, with a horrible QB situation, few holes, but almost no impact players on offense and much more depletion than the defense – which helped keep the team quasi-afloat over the past few seasons – has recently seen.

Las Vegas: We don't need a surplus of words to tell you that this roster is a nightmare on both sides of the ball.

NFC EAST

Philadelphia: The shocking and inexplicable collapse down the stretch in 2023 lingers as an issue that must be addressed, and the offensive line is more questionable than the Eagles are used to seeing, but Howie Roseman plugged a number of vacancies on both sides of the ball in an aggressive offseason and had his usual luck with stud players falling in the draft.

Dallas: While coaching has been a hot-seat issue for the better part of the last decade-and-a-half, the stealth issue holding back the team has been the stars-and-scrubs approach to franchise building and after a disastrous offseason, the balance between stars and scrubs is truly precarious, meaning that even in a shallow NFC, the Cowboys won't even be in a position to repeat their annual tradition of disappointing their fans in the playoffs – and that's not even taking into account the degree to which contract issues could poison the clubhouse..

Washington: If Jayden Daniels is legit, then this team is poised to make noise sooner rather than later, since the post-Daniel Snyder front office rebuilt the roster aggressively in the offseason.

New York Giants: The stench of Danny Dimes, as well as a bad offensive line and the loss of Saquon Barkley, marks this team as the early favorite for the first pick in the 2025 NFL Draft.

NFC NORTH

Detroit: We picked this team to reach the NFC Championship Game a year ago, which might have seemed a hipster pick but became exactly true, as the roster-building of the last two years has set up this team to go one step further this year – or, potentially, two steps.

Green Bay: Jordan Love emerged loudly in 2023, while the results of other roster construction announced themselves more quietly, and continued improvement from the QB could well make up for the remaining work to be done filling holes and put the team back in the playoffs.

Minnesota: We're dubious of the JJ McCarthy pick, but if the Vikings knew that they were doing with that, then they look like a playoff team, because they certainly knew what they were doing addressing other needs in the offseason.

Chicago: There's still work to be done in the trenches on both sides of the ball, but Bears fans will probably be forgiving since this offense is set up to be the most exciting since the dawn of the Korean War.

NFC SOUTH

Tampa Bay: This team still has some needs, some on the offensive line and some in the back seven, but in the land of the blind, the one-eyed man is king.

Atlanta: Before the draft, this team looked to be in position to take the divisional title (and get mucked on their home field in the wild card round, but still), but the goofy duplicative QB decisions and other bad draft moves definitely set them back.

New Orleans: The world record for the longest time treading water on the Gulf of Mexico goes to this franchise, as they enter what seems like their 59th consecutive season of having too many holes on both sides of the ball to win the league's crappiest division.

Carolina: Their buffoon owner serves as the poster child for a franchise that can't get out of its own way and has a roster in absolutely brutal shape.

NFC WEST

San Francisco: We graded the Niners a bit harshly in our draft ratings this season, but we did last season as well and they proved us wrong, but they may have to endure a transitional period at WR and they may well be weaker in the trenches on both sides of the ball than many would believe.

Los Angeles Rams: Last year, it seemed that the Rams had succeeded in retooling on the fly, but entering 2024 with needs on the OL and the back seven means that a repeat playoff appearance seems unlikely.

Seattle: The Seahawks hope to be invigorated by a coaching change, but that may not be enough considering the state of their offensive line and lingering issues on defense.

Arizona: They had an incredible draft, starting of course with the best overall player in Marvin Harrison, Jr., but this franchise is still at least 1-2 years from even the edge of contention and that's assuming that they remain at their current rate of success in rebuilding.
